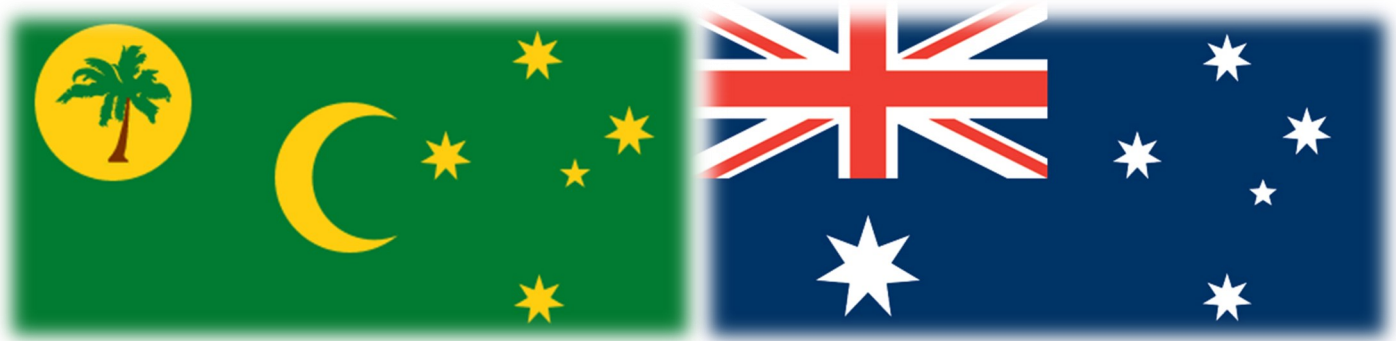

We now have a big Eagle on West Island. It is a Oriental Honey Buzzard. Now the big news, these birds feed on WASP'S nests. They have unusual feathers that deflect wasp and bee stings and they make a secretion on their feathers to repel bees and wasps. Their favourite food is wasp nests with lots of baby wasps still in their chambers. They migrate down from Siberia in October and form large flocks sometimes seen in their thousands flying over Bali. Six years ago one turned up in Perth and stayed for the summer, the next year it returned with a partner then the next year again it turned up with its partner and a youngster. This year there was four Honey Buzzards in Perth so bring them ON. There are more wasps nests on Cocos than a grand final crowd at the MCG. These Honey Buzzards also eat rats.

CEO update

From the CEO's Desk 19 May 2023



As we close in on the end of the financial year, your Council and its leadership team are doing a lot of work behind the scenes to prepare budgets and planning for the 2023 – 2024 financial year and into the future. Traditionally local government is seen as only responsible for “rates, rubbish and roads” and certainly this coming financial year a big focus for the Council will be rates, rubbish, and roads.

In a utopian society, rates and fees and charges set by Council will provide full cost recovery for the delivery of waste management (rubbish) and maintenance and upgrade of the road network (roads). There is no doubt that for many years, possibly if ever, the Shire has fallen short of the utopian society model in terms of full cost recovery for the delivery of waste management (rubbish) and maintenance and upgrade of the road network (roads).

Your elected Council had a workshop with the leadership team on Wednesday this week and during the 2023 – 2024 financial year, with inflation currently running at something like 7% we will be looking at a moderate rate rise of far less than this.

As the Chief Executive Officer of the Shire, the buck stops with me in terms of moving the Shire in the direction of sustainability and we cannot achieve this when we so heavily subsidise waste management. The Commonwealth has spent a long time developing a Waste Management Strategy for the Indian Ocean Territories and there is no silver lining in any clouds for the Cocos (Keeling) Islands because of this strategy.

Because changes must occur to the schedule of fees and charges Council approves for waste management, I believe as residents, ratepayers, commercial organisations, tourist operators, accommodation providers, government, and non-government agencies, you all need to be consulted on what lies ahead. The opportunity for face-to-face discussions is important to me and I will be holding community meetings on both West and Home Island in the near future to discuss the way forward.

West Island – TBC but planning on Wednesday 24.05.2023 at 5.00 p.m. Conference room and/or decking of CRC building. Should this change, social media, buy swap and sell, notice board and website postings will occur.

Home Island – TBC.

I urge constructive communication regarding the changes that need to occur and invite anyone interested to attend.

CEO update

Dari Meja CEO 19 May 2023



Ketika kami menghampiri penghujung tahun keuangan, Konsel anda dan team leadership sedang melakukan banyak kerja di belakang untuk menyediakan budget dan perancangan untuk tahun keuangan 2023 – 2024 dan masa depan. Secara tradisional lokal government dilihat hanya bertanggungjawab atas “rates, sampah dan jalan” dan tentunya fokus besar untuk tahun keuangan yang akan datang ini bagi Konsel adalah rates, sampah, dan jalan.

Dalam masyarakat yang sempurna, rates dan harga dan pembayaran yang ditetapkan oleh Konsel akan memberikan pemulihan ongkos sepenuhnya untuk penyampaian urusan sampah (sampah) dan maintenance dan peningkatan jalan (jalan). Tidak ada keraguan bahawa selama bertahun-tahun, mungkin jika pernah, Shire telah jatuh dari model masyarakat yang sempurna dari segi pemulihan ongkos penuh untuk penyampaian urusan sampah (sampah) dan maintenance dan peningkatan jalan (jalan).

Komiti pilihan anda mengadakan workshop dengan team leadership pada hari Rabu minggu ini dan selama tahun keuangan 2023 – 2024, dengan kenaikan yang saat ini yang sedang berjalan sekitar 7% kami akan melihat kenaikan rates yang sederhana jauh lebih rendah daripada ini.

Sebagai Chief Executive Officer Shire, tanggungjawab berhenti pada saya dalam hal menggerakkan Shire ke arah keberlanjutan dan kami tidak dapat mencapainya apabila kami memberi subsidi yang sangat besar pada pengurusan sampah. Komanwel telah mengambil masa yang lama untuk membuat Strategi Pengurusan Sampah untuk Indian Ocean Territories namun tidak ada sinar harapan terdapat untuk Pulu Cocos.

Oleh karena perubahan mesti berlaku pada harga dan pembayaran yang disetujui oleh Konsel untuk pengurusan sampah, saya percaya sebagai penduduk, pembayar rates, organisasi komersial, tukang bawak turis, penyedia tempat tinggal, kerajaan, dan agensi yang bukan kerajaan, anda semua perlu diberundingkan tentang perkara yang akan datang. Peluang untuk perbincangan secara bersemuka adalah penting bagi saya dan saya akan mengadakan mitingan masyarakat di Pulu Panjang dan Kampong dalam masa terdekat untuk membincangkan jalan ke hadapan.

Pulu Panjang – Akan di tentukan tetapi perancangan pada hari Rabu 24.05.2023 jam 5.00 petang. Kamar miting dan/atau emper CRC. Sekiranya ini berubah, siaran media sosial, buy swap and sell, notis board dan website akan berlaku.

Kampong – Akan di tentukan.

Saya mengharapkan bincangan yang berguna mengenai perubahan yang perlu berlaku dan menjemput sesiapa yang berminat untuk hadir.

Your Vehicle - Cocos (Keeling) Islands

Buy, sell or transfer a vehicle?

Are you looking to purchase, sell or transfer a vehicle? Below are steps you need to take.

- STEP 1 Buyer and seller to complete a Notification of change of ownership vehicle licence transfer (MR9) form from the Motor Vehicle Registry (MVR)
- STEP 2 Buyer to ensure a Government approved immobiliser is fitted to the vehicle
- STEP 3 Seller to give buyer the MR9 'Purchaser's copy' (red), vehicle licence document (rego papers) and any other applicable vehicle documentation. Recommend seller advise the buyer if a concession has been applied to the vehicle as the buyer will be required to restore the vehicle licence to full rates before the vehicle can be driven on the road
- STEP 4 Attend the MVR. Purchaser to submit forms and proof of identification. Seller to submit 'Seller's copy' within 7 days from sale of the vehicle.
- STEP 5 Purchaser to pay vehicle licence duty and transfer fee within 28 days of the invoice being issued. If invoice not paid by the due date a \$100 Transfer Infringement fine will be issued.

Plate and Transfer Infringements

Infringements will be issued for the following offences.

- Failing to make application to transfer a vehicle licence within the prescribed period.
- Failing to return number plates within three months of the expiry of the licence.
- Failing to return vehicle plates when requested by the Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

A customer may apply in writing to have an infringement withdrawn if they believe a valid reason exists. For example, a client may receive a \$100.00 plate infringement fine for an unregistered vehicle they no longer owned because they failed to complete and submit an MR9 form to the MVR so the vehicle could be transferred from their name to the new owner.

Clients can attend the MVR and complete an Application for Withdrawal of Infringement Notice (E17) and provide supporting documentation eg completed MR9 form. Requests are reviewed by a nominated officer of the Department of Transport.

Vehicle Safety

It is important that you keep your vehicle in a roadworthy condition so it will keep you and any passengers safe. If a vehicle is found to be unroadworthy the Australian Federal Police will apply a defect notice (also known as a yellow sticker or work order) and it must be inspected at an Authorised Inspection Station or specific inspection location. The Authorised Vehicle Examiner will conduct a full inspection of the vehicle.

Builder Registration: Request for Community Comments

The Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety (DMIRS), which is responsible for the regulation of the building industry in Western Australia and on the islands, is working with the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts (DITRDCA) to consider whether builders should be required to be registered on the island.

Registration would require builders to meet certain qualification and experience requirements, and would provide increased protection to consumers.

DMIRS invites members of the public to provide comments on this issue.

All comments received will be considered by DMIRS and DITRDCA in making its decision. Comments should be submitted in writing via email to registrationreview@dmirs.wa.gov.au. The deadline for submissions is **Friday 30 June 2023**.

The Department of Mines Industry Regulation and Safety, Associations and Charities Branch has emailed all registered Cocos Keeling Islands associations who have not lodged an annual Information statement (AIS) for at least the past three years.

All incorporated associations are required to lodge an AIS each year, within six months after the end of its financial year. An AIS provides the Commissioner for Consumer Protection with confirmation that an association is still operating and is complying with specific requirements under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (the Act).

Please make sure that you comply and respond to the Associations and Charities Branch email immediately to avoid possible commencement to deregister your association.

Department of Mines Industry Regulation and Safety, Associations and Charities Branch telah menghantar emel kepada semua persatuan Pulu Cocos yang diregista yang belum membuat laporan informasi tahunan (AIS) sekurang-kurangnya tiga tahun yang lalu.

Semua persatuan yang diperbadankan diharuskan untuk menyerahkan AIS setiap tahun, dalam tempoh enam bulan selepas berakhirnya tahun keuangannya. AIS memberikan Commissioner for Consumer Protection dengan pengesahan bahawa persatuan masih beroperasi dan mematuhi persyaratan khusus di bawah Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (Undang-undang).

Tolong pastikan anda mematuhi dan membalas emel Associations and Charities Branch dengan segera untuk mengelakkan kemungkinan permulaan untuk membatalkan regista persatuan anda.

Fines and enforcing fines III

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

This article will continue to look at ways that the Fines Enforcement Registry (FER) can enforce a fine debt against you if you have an unpaid fine.

The FER can issue an “enforcement warrant” to enforce your unpaid fine

If you do not pay your fine within the time for paying it, the FER can issue an enforcement warrant against you. This is one way for the FER to recover the fine debt you owe.

The enforcement warrant is given to an office called the Sheriff's Office. It gives the Sheriff authority to take action to recover the fine debt from you.

If the FER wants to issue an enforcement warrant, it must first send you a Notice of Intention to Enforce. An enforcement warrant can be issued if:

- 28 days have passed since you were sent a Notice of Intention to Enforce
- you have not paid the outstanding amount.

Under an enforcement warrant the Sheriff can:

- seize and sell your personal property (for example furniture, clothing, tools)
- lodge memorials (caveats) over real estate (land, houses) that you own
- wheel clamp your vehicles so they cannot move
- remove the number plates of your vehicles
- suspend and/or cancel your vehicle licence, or, if your vehicle is not licensed, stop you from licensing it
- deduct money from your wages or bank accounts (called a “garnishee order”).

Selling your property

The Sheriff must sell your personal property in preference to selling your real estate. It is only if the Sheriff believes that the fine debt cannot be satisfied by selling your personal property that they can sell your real estate.

There is some personal property that the Sheriff cannot take to sell. This includes medical or dental aids and equipment and family photographs or portraits.

There is some personal property that the Sheriff can take above a threshold of value for that category of item (for example clothes, tools, furniture or electrical goods). If the total value of all the items in a category is worth less than the threshold the Sheriff cannot take them.

Wheel clamping and removing number plates from vehicles

The Sheriff can put an immobilisation notice on your vehicle/s or clamp them. It is a criminal offence to interfere with the notice or the clamps.

If the Sheriff removes your number plates they must also suspend and disqualify your vehicle licence. The vehicle licence suspension and disqualification means that if you have a vehicle licence for the vehicle it is suspended and that if you do not have a vehicle licence for the vehicle, you cannot apply for one.

If you have still not paid after 28 days, the Sheriff may cancel and disqualify your vehicle licence. This means your vehicle licence is cancelled. It also means that if you do not have a vehicle licence for the vehicle, you cannot apply for one.

Garnishee orders on your bank account or your wages

The Sheriff can issue a garnishee order against your wages (called a “garnishee order on earnings”) or against your bank account (called a “bank account garnishee order”). Only one garnishee order can be in force at any time.

The garnishee order is issued either to your employer or your bank. If it is to your employer, it directs your employer to pay a certain amount from your wages to the Sheriff to pay your fine debt. If you earn less than a certain threshold amount in any pay period, no money can be deducted. This threshold amount is called a “protected” amount.

If it is to your bank, it directs your bank to pay money from your bank account to the Sheriff to satisfy your fine debt. It can be a one-off payment, or several payments. If the amount in your bank account is less than a certain threshold, the bank is not allowed to pay the Sheriff. This threshold amount is called a “protected” amount.

It is an offence if you do something to try to stop the money being taken from your bank account, such as by withdrawing money or closing the account. You must tell the Sheriff if you close your account/s or if someone who normally pays into your account stops doing so. It is an offence not to tell the Sheriff if this occurs.

Stopping the enforcement warrant being actioned

If you cannot pay your fine debt and an enforcement warrant has been issued, you may be able to apply for a “stay of execution”, to temporarily stop the enforcement warrant being actioned in one the ways listed above. A stay of execution is a formal payment agreement you enter into with the Sheriff.

Under a stay of execution agreement you agree to either pay the whole amount owing by a certain date or to make scheduled payments to pay off your debt. If you miss a payment the stay of execution can be cancelled and the enforcement warrant can be actioned.

Denda dan penguatkuasaan denda III

Ini adalah artikel pendek mengenai perkara undang-undang yang mungkin menarik untuk anda. Ini bukan nasihat undang-undang. Anda mesti selalu mendapatkan nasihat undang-undang sendiri untuk keadaan anda.

Artikel ini akan terus melihat cara Fines Enforcement Registry (FER) boleh menguatkuasakan hutang denda terhadap anda jika anda ada denda yang belum dibayar.

FER boleh keluarkan “surat perintah penguatkuasaan” untuk menguatkuasakan denda anda yang belum dibayar

Jika anda tidak membayar denda anda dalam masa pembayarannya, FER boleh keluarkan surat perintah penguatkuasaan terhadap anda. Ini adalah satu cara untuk FER mendapatkan kembali hutang denda yang anda ada.

Surat penguatkuasaan diberikan kepada opis yang dipanggil Opis Sheriff. Ia memberi kuasa kepada Sheriff untuk mengambil tindakan untuk mendapatkan semula hutang denda dari anda.

Jika FER ingin mengeluarkan surat perintah penguatkuasaan, ia harus hantar Notis Niat untuk Menguatkuasakan terlebih dahulu kepada anda. Surat perintah penguatkuasaan boleh dikeluarkan jika:

- 28 hari telah berlalu sejak anda dikasi Notis Niat untuk Menguatkuasakan
- anda belum bayar jumlah yang terhutang.

Di bawah surat perintah penguatkuasaan Sheriff boleh:

- amek dan jual harta peribadi anda (contohnya bekakas rumah, pakaian, berkakas)
- menempatkan peringatan (peringatan) atas real estate (tanah, rumah) yang anda miliki
- menjepit roda kereta anda supaya tidak boleh bergerak
- cabut nomor plat kereta anda
- menggantung dan/atau membatalkan lesen kereta anda, atau, jika kereta anda tidak diregista, menghentikan anda dari meregista itu
- memotong duit dari gaji atau bank akaun anda (dipanggil “garnishee order”).

Menjual properti anda

Sheriff harus menjual properti peribadi anda daripada menjual real estate anda. Hanya jika Sheriff percaya bahawa hutang denda tidak dapat dipenuhi dengan menjual properti peribadi anda barulah mereka boleh menjual real estate anda.

Ada beberapa properti peribadi yang Sheriff tidak boleh ambil untuk dijual. Ini termasuk bantuan perubatan atau bantuan pergigian dan bekakas serta gambar keluarga.

Ada beberapa properti peribadi yang Sheriff boleh ambil melebihi nilai threshold untuk kategori item tersebut (contohnya pakaian, bekakas, bekakas rumah atau barang elektrik). Jika jumlah nilai semua item dalam kategori bernilai kurang daripada threshold Sheriff tidak boleh mengambilnya.

Jepit tayar dan menyabut nomor plat dari kereta

Sheriff boleh meletakkan notis penghentian pada kereta anda atau menjepitnya. Ia adalah satu kesalahan kriminal untuk mengganggu notis atau penjepitnya.

Jika Sheriff cabut nomor plat anda mereka juga harus menggantung and membatalkan regista kereta anda. Penggantungan dan pembatalan regista kereta bermakna jika anda mempunyai registrasen untuk kereta itu ia digantung dan jika anda tidak ada registrasen untuk kereta itu, anda tidak boleh memohon untuk mendapatkannya.

Jika anda masih belum membuat bayaran selepas 28 hari, Sheriff boleh membatalkan regista kereta anda. Ini bermakna regista kereta anda dibatalkan. Ini juga bermakna jika anda tidak mempunyai registrasen untuk kereta itu, anda tidak boleh memohon satu.

Garnishee orders pada akaun bank atau gaji anda

Sheriff boleh keluarkan perintah memotong duit dari gaji anda (dipanggil “garnishee order untuk pendapatan”) atau dari bank akaun (dipanggil “bank akaun garnishee order”). Hanya satu perintah garnishee boleh berkuat kuasa setiap saat.

Perintah garnishee dikeluarkan sama ada kepada majikan atau bank anda. Jika kepada majikan anda, ia mengarahkan majikan anda untuk membayar jumlah tertentu dari gaji anda kepada Sheriff untuk membayar hutang denda anda. Jika pendapat anda kurang dari jumlah threshold dalam tempoh gajian, tidak ada uang yang boleh dipotong. Jumlah threshold ini dipanggil jumlah “dilindungi”.

Jika ke bank anda, ia mengarahkan bank anda untuk membayar dari akaun bank anda kepada Sheriff untuk membayar hutang denda anda. Ini bisa merupakan bayaran satu kali, atau beberapa bayaran. Jika jumlah dalam akaun anda kurang daripada threshold tertentu, bank tidak dibenarkan untuk membayar Sheriff. Jumlah threshold ini dipanggil jumlah “dilindungi”.

Adalah satu kesalahan jika anda melakukan sesuatu untuk cuba menghentikan pengambilan uang dari bank akaun anda, seperti dengan mengeluarkan uang atau menutup akaun. Anda mesti kasitahu Sheriff jika anda tutup akaun anda atau jika orang yang biasanya membayar ke akaun anda berhenti melakukannya. Adalah satu kesalahan untuk tidak kasitahu Sheriff jika ini berlaku.

Menghentikan surat penguatkuasaan yang sedang diambil tindakan

Jika anda tidak dapat membayar hutang denda anda dan surat penguatkuasaan telah dikeluarkan, anda mungkin boleh memohon “penggantungan pelaksanaan”, untuk menghentikan sementara surat penguatkuasaan diambil tindakan dalam satu cara yang disebut di atas. Penggantungan pelaksanaan ialah perjanjian pembayaran rasmi yang anda buat dengan Sheriff.

Di bawah perjanjian penggantungan pelaksanaan anda bersetuju sama ada membayar semua jumlah hutang pada hari bulan tertentu atau untuk membuat jadwal bayaran untuk membayar hutang anda. Jika anda ketinggalan bayaran penggantungan pelaksanaan boleh dibatalkan dan surat penguatkuasaan boleh diambil tindakan.

Fun Facts

A lime is a hybrid citrus fruit.

There are several species of citrus trees whose fruits are called limes, including the Persian lime, Key lime, kaffir lime, and desert lime.

Although the precise origin is uncertain, wild limes are believed to have first grown in Indonesia or Southeast Asia.

The leaves are ovate, 2.5–9 cm (1–3.5 in) long, glossy, light or dark green colored.

The fruit is usually about 3–6 centimeters (1.2–2.4 inches) in diameter, oval to nearly globular in shape, the peel is thin and greenish yellow when the fruit is ripe.

The pulp is tender, juicy, yellowish green in color, and decidedly acid.

Raw limes are 88% water, 10% carbohydrates and less than 1% each of fat and protein.

Limes have higher contents of sugars and acids than lemons do.

The health benefits of lime are due to its many nutritious elements like vitamin C, vitamin B6, vitamin A, vitamin E, folate, niacin thiamin, riboflavin, pantothenic acid, copper, calcium, iron, magnesium, potassium, zinc, phosphorus and protein.

Lime also contains flavonoids, which are composites that contain antioxidant and cancer fighting properties. It helps prevent diabetes, constipation, high blood pressure, fever, indigestion, as well as improve the skin, hair, and teeth.

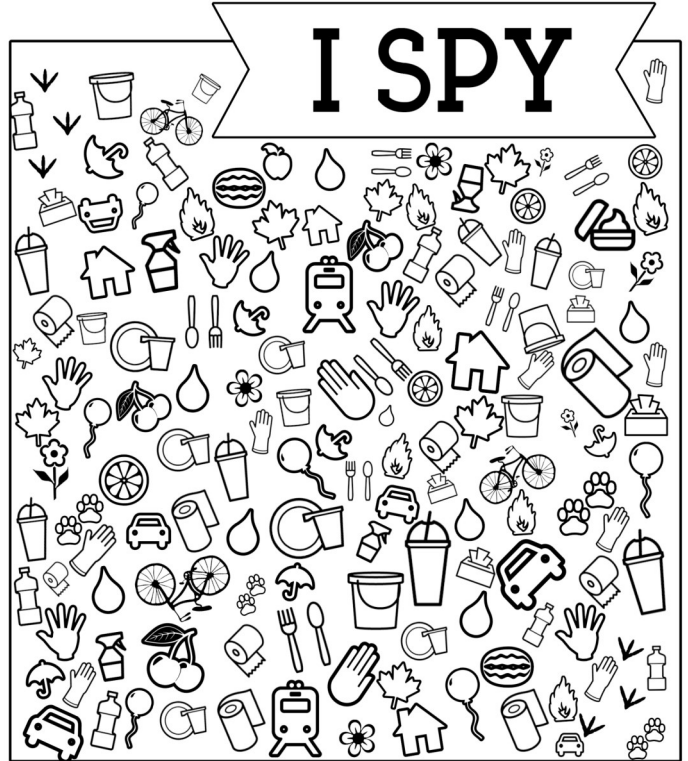
