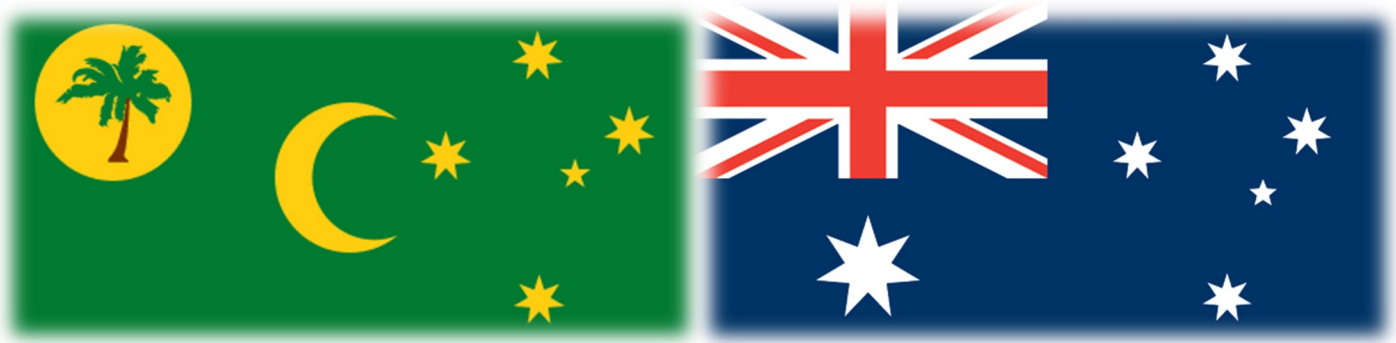

CEO update

We are now well and truly into 2022. It is hard to believe, with Christmas, New Year and January all rushing by so quickly. I am very excited to see the partnership between the Shire and the Community Resource Centre expanded with the CRC taking a lead role in the Atoll production and distribution. Already we have seen some excellent additions to the Atoll as regular segments.

Whilst January may have been quiet for many, there has been plenty happening on CKI and at the Shire, with much more to come for 2022. Together with Shire staff, we would like to expand on some of the highlights and important topics.

Cat Control Program

There are significant issues with unsterilised cats on island and in particular within the Home Island settlement. A recent visit by the participating vet to primarily to undertake cat desexing and microchipping program occurred in January.

The vet was on island for a week and with assistance from the Shire Ranger approximately 30 cats were sterilised and microchipped.

Whilst this has been a very successful visit, we are aware that there are some cats that have been missed (both feral and pet). The Shire will be in contact with those cat owners that did not take this opportunity to register, sterilise and microchip their cat.

There is more work to be done and we ask everyone to do their part.

We ask that you please contact the Shire Ranger immediately if one of the following applies to you:

- Your cat has kittens and you do not intend on keeping, registering and sterilising them
- Your cat/kittens are not registered, microchipped or sterilised
- A feral cat needs to be reported in your area
- You find kittens/feral cats

Dumping of kittens or cats is not acceptable and we will be monitoring for this going forward.

Unregistered cats are responsible for the majority of animal nuisance in the community. Please assist the community in controlling the unwanted feral cat problem.

Waste Management Update

The Department of Water and Environment Regulation (DWER) has directed the Shire to manage access to the transfer stations on both West Island and Home Island. This is not only a requirement of the Shire waste licence conditions but as a result of complaints from the community.

The Shire is in the process of establishing fencing and gates at each of the facilities to control access. It is intended that each site will be open between certain hours each workday for public access.

Waste will continue to be accepted at each site with waste segregation at the gate.

The Shire is investigating short-term measures to reduce this impact including additional kerbside waste collection if necessary.

CEO update

Kita kini berada dalam keadaan baik dan benar-benar memasoki tahun 2022. Susah untuk dipercayai, dengan Krismas, Tahun Baru dan Januari semuanya berlalu dengan begitu cepat. Saya sangat senang untuk melihat perkongsian antara Konsel dan Komuniti Resource Centre berkembang dengan CRC mengambil peranan utama dalam pengeluaran dan pengedaran Atoll. Program Kontrol Kucing

Terdapat isu penting dengan kucing yang tidak disterilkan di pulu dan khususnya dalam perkampungan Home Island. Lawatan baru-baru ini oleh doktor haiwan yang mengambil bahagian terutamanya untuk menjalankan program desexing sunat dan mikrochip kucing berlaku pada bulan Januari.

Doktor haiwan itu berada di pulu selama seminggu dan dengan bantuan daripada Renjer Konsel kira-kira 30 ekor kucing telah disterilkan dan dimikrochip.

Walaupun ini merupakan lawatan yang sangat berjaya, kami sedar bahawa terdapat beberapa kucing yang terlewat (baik yang liar dan kucing peliharaan). Konsel akan berhubung dengan pemilik kucing yang tidak mengambil peluang ini untuk mendaftar, mensterilkan dan membuat mikrochip kucing mereka.

Terdapat lebih banyak kerja yang perlu dilakukan dan kami meminta semua orang untuk membuat bahagian mereka.

Kami meminta anda menghubungi Renjer Konsel dengan segera jika salah satu daripada perkara berikut berkenaan dengan anda:

- -Kucing anda mempunyai anak kucing dan anda tidak berniat untuk memelihara, mendaftar dan mensterilkannya
- -Kucing/anak kucing anda tidak didaftarkan, microchip atau disterilkan
- -Kucing liar perlu dilaporkan didalam kawasan anda
- -Anda dapati anak kucing/kucing liar

Pembuangan anak kucing atau kucing tidak boleh diterima dan kami akan mengawasi perkara ini pada masa hadapan.

Kucing yang tidak berdaftar bertanggungjawab terhadap kebanyakan gangguan binatang dalam komuniti. Tolong bantu komuniti dalam mengawal masalah kucing liar yang tidak diingini.

Berita Terbaru Pengurusan Sampah

Departmen Peratoran Ayer dan Alam Sekitar (DWER) telah mengarahkan Konsel untuk menguruskan akses ke stesen pemindahan sampah di West Island dan Home Island. Ini bukan sahaja syarat syarat lesen kepada Konsel tetapi juga hasil komplek daripada masyarakat.

Sentencing – what punishments can a court give you for criminal offences I?

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

This is the first of six articles about sentencing (where the court gives you a penalty) when you are convicted (found guilty) of a criminal offence. You can be found guilty either because you admit guilt (plead guilty) or because you are found guilty by the court after a trial. There are also other orders that the court may be able to make in addition to your penalty.

Note that sentencing for state-based offences is different to sentencing for Commonwealth offences. We will deal with Commonwealth sentencing in the fifth article.

We will look at all sorts of things about sentencing – the purposes of sentencing (why you are given a penalty), the principles and rules that the court applies when it is sentencing you, the things that the court can do before sentencing you, the types of penalties (punishments) you can be given (sentencing options) and sentencing for Commonwealth offences.

What are the reasons for giving you a penalty?

Over many years, society has developed a number of purposes for the court (what the court is trying to achieve) in giving you a penalty for your criminal offence. They are as follows:

- Punishment for the offence
- Your rehabilitation (making you better so that you will not continue to offend)
- Specific deterrence – to stop (deter) you from doing this again
- General deterrence – your punishment will be a warning and stop (deter) other people from committing the same offence
- Community protection – to protect the community from you and from crime generally
- Denunciation (strong disapproval or blame by the community) – the penalty is a public statement that the criminal offence is unacceptable
- Restorative justice – making things better between you the offender, the victim and the community

For some crimes, or some situations, some purposes may be more important than other purposes. For example, for serious crimes such as murder, sexual assaults, armed robbery and other crimes the court may think that punishment, specific deterrence, general deterrence and community protection is very important.

Another example might be if you keep committing the same offence, then the court may think that the purposes of specific deterrence (stopping you doing it again) and punishment are very important. An example might be if you keep on committing drink-driving offences.

For other crimes, or other situations, the court may think that other purposes, such as your rehabilitation or restorative justice might be more important. This might be for example if you are a young person and it is very important to rehabilitate you so that you will not keep committing offences.

Sentencing – what punishments can a court give you for criminal offences I? (continued)

What are some of the guiding principles that the court must apply when giving you a penalty?

There are a number of guiding principles that the court must always apply when giving you a penalty (sentencing you).

The guiding principles include:

1. The sentence (penalty) must be appropriate to the criminal offence. In making the decision about the penalty, the court must think about:
 - The actual maximum penalty for the offence.
 - The circumstances in which you committed the offence, including if any victim was a vulnerable person (for example, a child or an elderly person).
 - Whether there are mitigating factors in your favour. Mitigating factors lessen the seriousness of the offence. Examples might be if you have no prior offences, if you have shown remorse (where you show you are sorry), if you pleaded guilty early or if you have already taken steps to rehabilitate yourself.
 - Whether there are aggravating factors to your offence. Aggravating factors increase the seriousness of the offence. Examples are where victims are children or older people, or where an attack on someone occurs in their own home, or where your offence has been carefully planned.
2. The sentence must take into account your total criminal behaviour for all of the offences for which you are being sentenced and for which you are already in prison and make sure that the total penalty is not greater than your total criminal behaviour. This is called “the totality principle”. It usually means that where you are being sentenced for a number of offences your total sentence is less than if you were sentenced individually for each of the offences and those sentences simply added on top of each other.
3. The sentence must take into account the sentence given to anyone else who committed the same offence with you (a co-offender) to make sure that there is equality (parity) between your sentences, taking into account everyone’s individual circumstances in committing the offence.
4. Before giving you a certain penalty, the court must always think about whether it can give you a lesser penalty. And if you are given a sentence of imprisonment it can only be because the offence you have committed is so serious that you cannot be given a lesser sentence.

In the next article we will look at the things that the court can do before giving you your penalty.

Hukuman – apakah hukuman yang boleh diberikan oleh mahkamah kepada anda untuk kesalahan jenayah?

Ini adalah artikel pendek tentang isu undang-undang yang mungkin menarik minat anda. Mereka bukan nasihat undang-undang. Anda harus sentiasa mendapatkan nasihat undang-undang tersendiri untuk keadaan anda.

Ini adalah yang pertama daripada enam artikel mengenai hukuman (di mana mahkamah memberi anda penalti) apabila anda dihukum (didapati bersalah) atas kesalahan jenayah. Anda boleh didapati bersalah sama ada kerana anda mengaku bersalah (ngaku bersalah) atau kerana anda didapati bersalah oleh mahkamah selepas perbicaraan. Terdapat juga perintah lain yang mungkin boleh dibuat oleh mahkamah sebagai tambahan kepada penalti anda.

Ambil perhatian bahawa hukuman bagi kesalahan berasaskan negeri adalah berbeza dengan hukuman bagi kesalahan Komanwel. Kami akan menangani hukuman Komanwel dalam artikel kelima.

Kami akan melihat pelbagai perkara tentang hukuman – tujuan menjatuhkan hukuman (mengapa anda diberi penalti), prinsip dan peratoran yang digunakan oleh mahkamah semasa menjatuhkan hukuman kepada anda, perkara yang boleh dilakukan oleh mahkamah sebelum menjatuhkan hukuman kepada anda, jenis penalti (hukuman) anda boleh diberikan (pilihan hukuman) dan hukuman bagi kesalahan Komanwel.

Apakah sebab untuk memberi anda penalti?

Selama bertahun-tahun, masyarakat telah membangunkan beberapa tujuan untuk mahkamah (apa yang mahkamah coba capai) dalam memberi anda penalti untuk kesalahan jenayah anda. Mereka adalah seperti berikut:

- Hukuman untuk kesalahan
- Pemulihan anda (menjadikan anda lebih baik supaya anda tidak akan terus membuat kesalahan)
- Pencegahan khusus – untuk menghentikan (menghalang) anda daripada melakukan ini lagi
- Pencegahan umum – hukuman anda akan menjadi amaran dan menghentikan (menghalang) orang lain daripada melakukan kesalahan yang sama
- Perlindungan komuniti – untuk melindungi komuniti daripada anda dan daripada jenayah secara umumnya
- Pengecaman (penolakan atau kesalahan yang kuat oleh masyarakat) – penalti ialah kenyataan awam bahawa kesalahan jenayah itu tidak boleh diterima
- Keadilan pemulihan – menjadikan keadaan lebih baik antara anda sebagai pesalah, mangsa dan masyarakat

Untuk beberapa jenayah, atau beberapa keadaan, beberapa tujuan mungkin lebih penting daripada tujuan lain. Sebagai contoh, untuk jenayah berat seperti pembunuhan, serangan seksual, rompakan bersenjata dan jenayah lain mahkamah mungkin berpendapat bahawa hukuman, pencegahan khusus, pencegahan biasa dan perlindungan masyarakat adalah sangat penting.

Contoh lain mungkin jika anda terus melakukan kesalahan yang sama, maka mahkamah mungkin berpendapat bahawa tujuan pencegahan khusus (menghentikan anda melakukannya lagi) dan hukuman adalah sangat penting. Contohnya mungkin jika anda terus melakukan kesalahan memandu dalam keadaan mabuk.

Untuk jenayah lain, atau situasi lain, mahkamah mungkin berpendapat bahawa tujuan lain, seperti pemulihan atau keadilan pemulihan anda mungkin lebih penting. Ini mungkin sebagai contoh jika anda seorang yang muda dan adalah sangat penting untuk memulihkan anda supaya anda tidak akan terus melakukan kesalahan.

Hukuman – apakah hukuman yang boleh diberikan oleh mahkamah kepada anda untuk kesalahan jenayah?

(selanjutnya)

Apakah beberapa prinsip panduan yang mesti digunakan oleh mahkamah apabila memberi anda penalti?

Terdapat beberapa prinsip panduan yang mahkamah mesti sentiasa pakai apabila memberi anda penalti (menghukum anda).

1. Prinsip panduan termasuk:

- Hukuman (penalti) mestilah bersesuaian dengan kesalahan jenayah. Dalam membuat keputusan mengenai penalti, mahkamah mesti memikirkan:
 - Penalti maksimum sebenar bagi kesalahan itu.
 - Keadaan di mana anda melakukan kesalahan itu, termasuk jika mana-mana mangsa adalah orang yang terdedah (contohnya, kanak-kanak atau orang tua).
 - Sama ada terdapat faktor pengurangan yang memihak kepada anda. Faktor pengurangan mengurangkan keseriusan kesalahan. Contohnya mungkin jika anda tidak melakukan kesalahan terdahulu, jika anda telah menunjukkan penyesalan (di mana anda menunjukkan anda menyesal), jika anda mengaku bersalah awal atau jika anda telah mengambil langkah untuk memulihkan diri anda.
 - Sama ada terdapat faktor yang memburukkan kesalahan anda. Faktor yang memburukkan meningkatkan keseriusan kesalahan. Contohnya adalah apabila mangsa adalah kanak-kanak atau orang yang lebih tua, atau apabila serangan terhadap seseorang berlaku di rumah mereka sendiri, atau di mana kesalahan anda telah dirancang dengan teliti.
2. Hukuman itu mesti mengambil kira jumlah kelakuan jenayah anda untuk semua kesalahan yang anda sedang dijatuhkan hukuman dan yang anda sudah berada di dalam penjara dan pastikan jumlah penalti tidak lebih besar daripada jumlah kelakuan jenayah anda. Ini dipanggil "prinsip keseluruhan". Ia biasanya bermakna di mana anda dijatuhkan hukuman untuk beberapa kesalahan jumlah hukuman anda adalah kurang daripada jika anda dihukum secara tersendiri untuk setiap kesalahan dan ayat tersebut hanya ditambah di atas satu sama lain.
3. Hukuman itu mesti mengambil kira hukuman yang diberikan kepada sesiapa sahaja yang melakukan kesalahan yang sama dengan anda (pesalah bersama) untuk memastikan terdapat persamaan (pariti) antara hukuman anda, dengan mengambil kira keadaan tersendiri setiap orang dalam melakukan kesalahan itu.
4. Sebelum memberi anda penalti tertentu, mahkamah mesti sentiasa memikirkan sama ada ia boleh memberi anda penalti yang lebih rendah. Dan jika anda dijatuhkan hukuman penjara hanya boleh kerana kesalahan yang anda lakukan adalah sangat serius sehingga anda tidak boleh dikenakan hukuman yang lebih ringan.

Dalam artikel seterusnya kita akan melihat perkara yang boleh dilakukan oleh mahkamah sebelum memberi anda penalti.

Bites/Stings/Coral Cuts

Centipede bites

- Pain/swelling/redness at sting site
- Can also cause headache/palpitations/nausea/vomiting and anxiety
- Symptoms usually resolve in 48hrs
- Can become infected

Treatment

- Apply heat to bite site as quickly as possible either immersion or hot pack
- Cold pack can be used to reduce swelling
- Analgesics – Paracetamol, Ibuprofen
- Tetanus prophylaxis (tetanus within the past 10 years)

Scorpion stings

- Pain/swelling/redness/numbness

Treatment

- Wash sting site with soap and water
- Cold pack for swelling
- Analgesic – Paracetamol/ Ibuprofen
- Tetanus prophylaxis

Wasps

- Pain/swelling/redness/itchiness

Treatment

- Wash area with soap and water to remove venom
- Cold pack to reduce swelling (can use heat if tolerated)
- Analgesic – Paracetamol/ Ibuprofen
- Keep wound clean and dry

Coral cuts

- Inflamed/red/swollen/tender
- Easily infected if not cleaned thoroughly
- Tetanus prophylaxis

Treatment

- Wash thoroughly with clean water
- Cover with light dressing
- Attend clinic for antibiotics and tetanus prophylaxis if signs of infection – redness, pus, increasing pain
- No swimming until healed

Jellyfish Sting

- Pain
- Marks to skin
- Increased heart rate/ increased blood pressure/ trouble breathing

Treatment

- Remove tentacles
- Immerse in hot water if possible
- DO NOT use vinegar – can stimulate the discharge and increase pain
- Can use ice packs for pain also
- Analgesics – Paracetamol/Ibuprofen

Present to clinic:

Allergic reaction

- Seek help if severe reaction
- Shortness of breath/unable to breath/swelling lips and mouth/wheeze or noisy breathing/severe rash/severe swelling/collapse

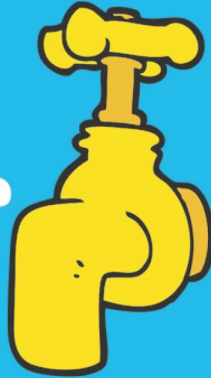

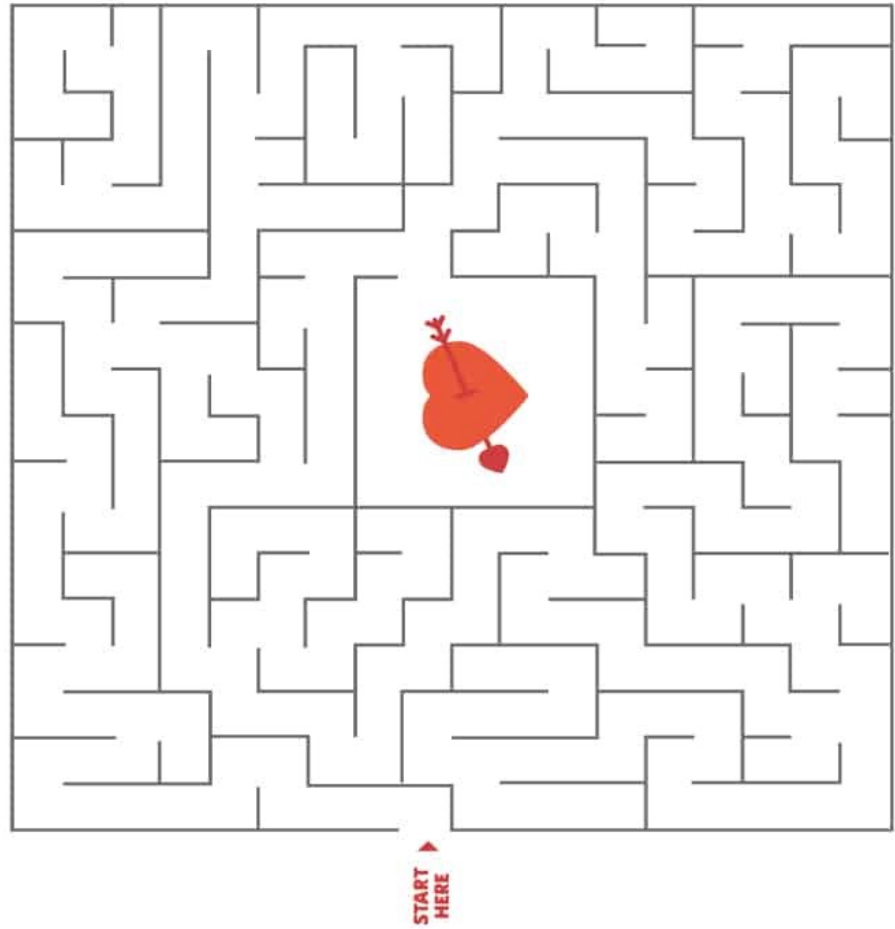
