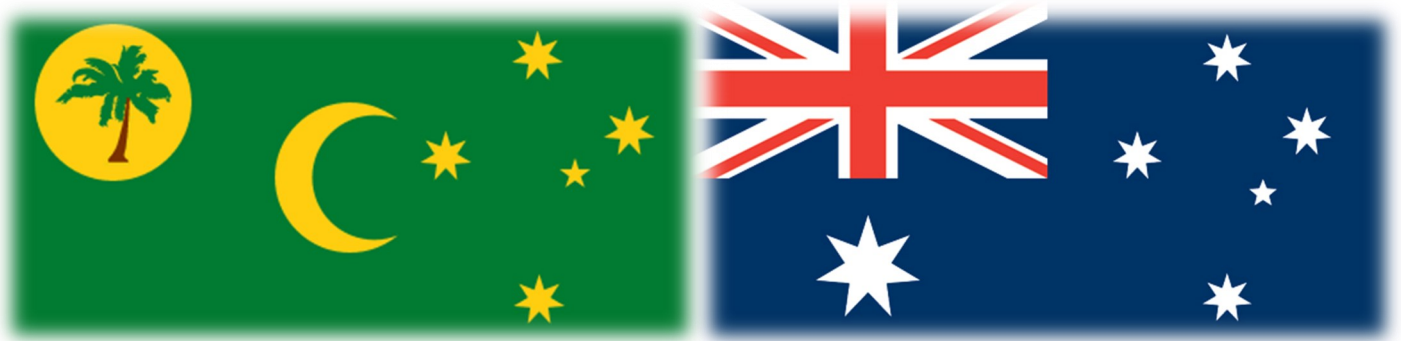

CASUAL SUPPORT OFFICER

The Cocos (K) Islands Community Resource Centre and the Cocos Keeling Islands Visitor Centre is seeking an enthusiastic, hard-working person for the casual position of Support Officer.

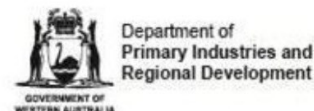

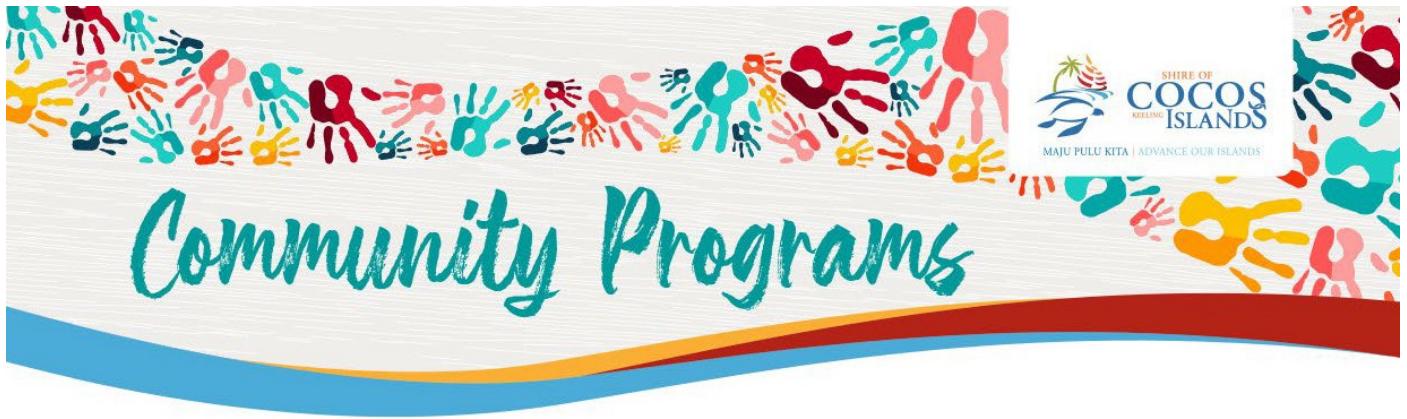

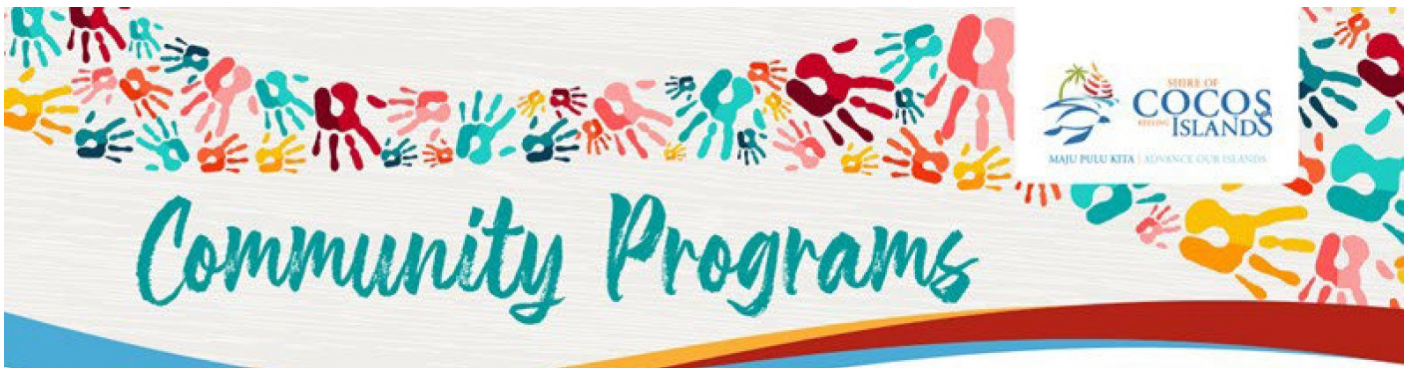
Council is dedicated to ensuring the arts are part of everyday life in Cocos, as well as developing artistic thinking in the community through the work of the Community Arts Group.

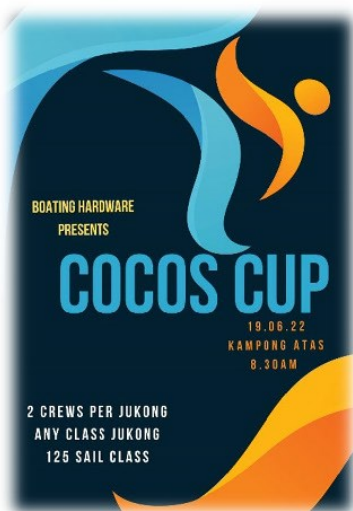

The IOTHS includes a 24 hour eight bed hospital and primary care facility on CI and clinics on Home and West Islands in the CKI. The IOTHS is committed to “Working with our communities to keep us healthy for the whole of our lives”.

The key responsibilities of the Registered Nurse position are to deliver direct, high quality and comprehensive nursing care and individual case management and to act as a professional role model, resource and support for colleagues.

Our ideal applicant is highly motivated, adaptable and willing to be actively involved in health promotion activities. The successful candidate will independently manage one or more health portfolios and be required to participate in a 24/7 roster, including night shift, weekends and public holidays. Potential future opportunities on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands is also a possibility.

To be considered, applicants must be currently registered as a Registered Nurse with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) and have recent demonstrable nursing experience in a rural and remote setting. Who we are

The Marine and Island Parks Branch supports the Director of National Parks' management of Commonwealth parks and gardens to protect, conserve and enhance their values for the use and well-being of all Australians. The branch is responsible for the day-to-day management of one of the of 60 Australian Marine Parks, Christmas Island National Park, Pulu-Keeling National Park and Norfolk Island National Park (including the Norfolk Island Botanic Garden).

Pulu Keeling National Park is one of the Australian Government's smallest national parks; nevertheless, it is a place of considerable international conservation significance. As an isolated coral atoll in an almost natural state, its relatively pristine environment is a valuable biological asset and an increasingly scarce feature in the tropics. The park was established on 12 December 1995 and comprises North Keeling Island and its surrounding marine waters within a roughly rectangular boundary, framing 2,602 hectares of land and sea. The park is a Commonwealth reserve under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act)* and is managed in accordance with the Act and the regulations made under it.

The Job

Under the limited direction of the Island Parks Manager located on Christmas Island, implement, report and adapt monitoring programs at Pulu Keeling National Park. This includes coordinating the monitoring and management program for the Pulu Keeling National Park, contributing expertise and knowledge to broader Cocos Island conservation programs in partnership with the Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands and liaising with the Cocos Island community stakeholders on behalf of Parks Australia.

In this role you will be responsible for:

- under the limited direction of the Island Parks manager, managing the operations in accordance with the lease with the Cocos (Keeling) Island Shire Council for the North Keeling Island, the Pulu Keeling Management Plan, *Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act)* and other relevant Plans with duties that include:
 - in consultation with Island Parks Manager, reviewing, coordinating, adapting and implementing terrestrial and marine environmental policies and natural and cultural resource management programs
 - coordinate field work, monitor and report on the status of threatened and Invasive Species populations
 - plan and coordinate maintenance of marine and terrestrial assets
 - design and delivery of environmental education and interpretation programs for school holiday activities
 - contribute to departmental reporting, scientific research and advisory panels reports and papers
 - undertake procurement and project management associated activities with operations and asset replacement
 - effectively managing allocated resources including staff, budget and assets
 - Represent Parks Australia and liaise with a wide range of stakeholders including researchers, government agencies and community
 - exercise compliance and enforcement duties under the EPBC Act (1999) and regulations
 - lead, train and mentor a small team of staff, Shire staff and volunteers
 - undertake other duties as directed in accordance with Pulu Keeling National Park work programs.

What we are looking for

Knowledge and experience

We thrive when our teams are made up of people from different backgrounds, cultures, genders, education, training and skills. Skills and capabilities form the selection criteria that candidates will be assessed against.

- Demonstrated experience in national park management and/or natural and cultural resource management, with an emphasis on field work and reporting for marine and island ecosystems.
- Demonstrated ability to manage staff, financial resources and assets effectively in a changing environment.
- Experience managing sensitive community issues and maintaining productive community and stakeholder relationships.
- An understanding of and ability to apply Commonwealth law enforcement procedures and relevant legislation.
- Demonstrated ability to live and work effectively in a small, multi-cultural and very isolated community.
- An understanding of Workplace Diversity, Workplace Participation, Work Health and Safety and the ability to apply and promote them in the workplace.

The successful applicant must:

- hold a current Apply First Aid Certificate or have the ability to obtain this qualification
- hold a current coxswains licence or have the ability to obtain
- hold and maintain a current manual driver's licence and ability to drive a 4WD vehicle
- hold and maintain a valid Australian motor vehicle drivers licence
- note that relocation assistance is subject to negotiation
- note that the physical requirements of the role(s) involve a combination of outdoor and office-based work
- note that you may be required to perform occasional out-of-hours and weekend work
- note that you will be required to complete specific training (including refresher training) related to the role including remote area training, defensive driving, first aid and CPR courses
- note that you will be required, from time to time, to work in difficult, remote and harsh environments (possibly for extended periods) under limited supervision or in teams
- have the ability to obtain and maintain a working with children and vulnerable people check
- wear an official uniform supplied by the department, including during field operations (as applicable), in accordance with the department's uniform policy
- wear appropriate protective personal equipment and clothing to comply with departmental Work Health & Safety policies and procedures
- have strong swimming skills
- have a reasonable level of fitness to undertake fieldwork in marine environment
- hold Wardens or Rangers qualification or commitment to obtaining this qualification.

It's been said that 'thoughts are like things'... that they actually contain dynamic power. Have you ever thought about thoughts like that?

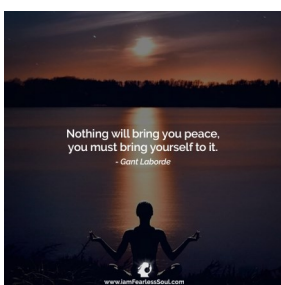

Things you will need:

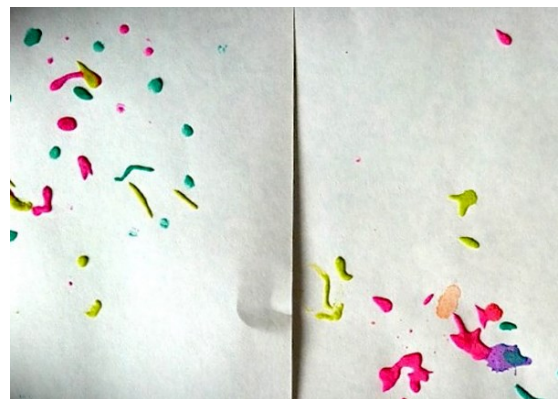
1/2 Cup of salt

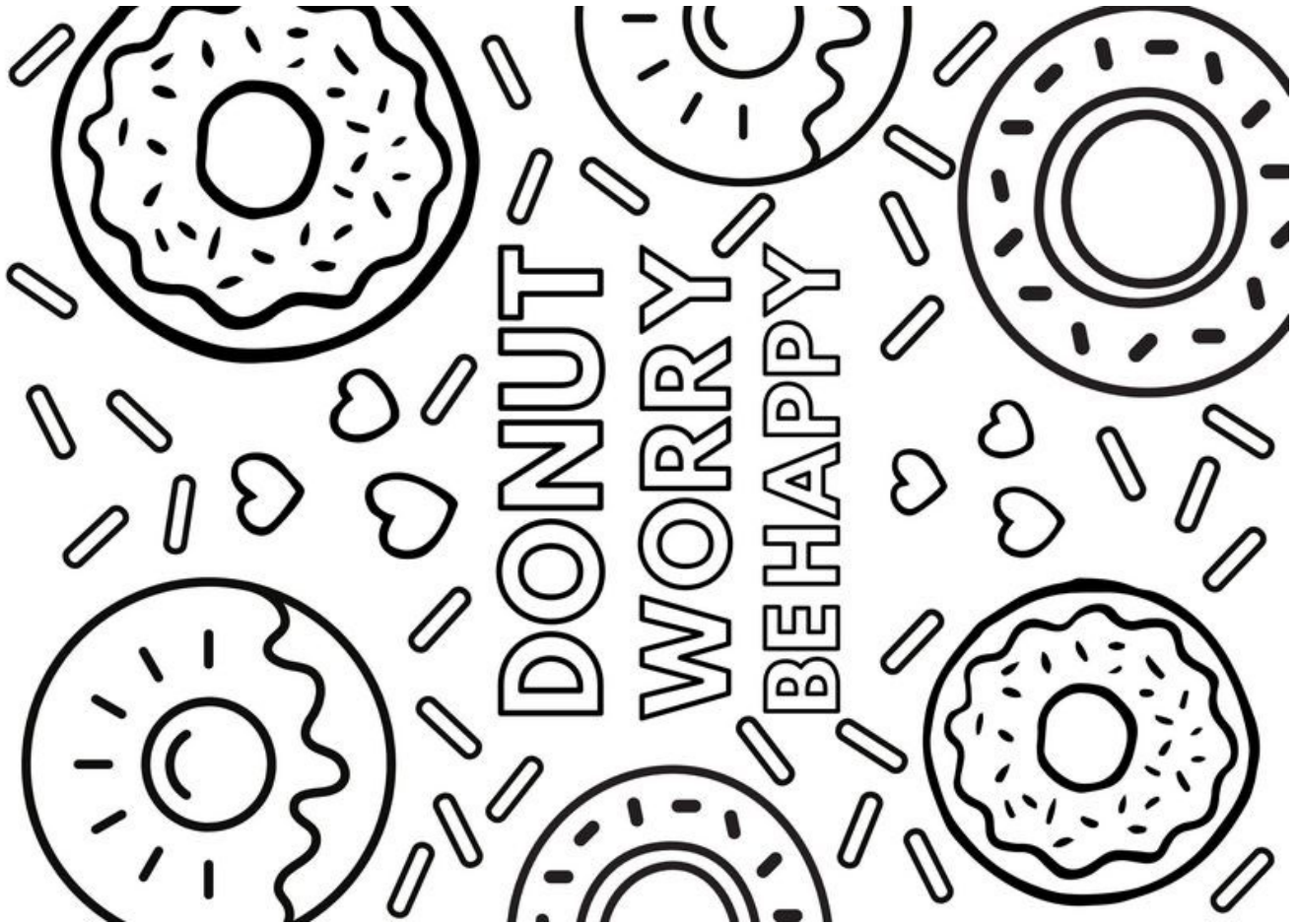

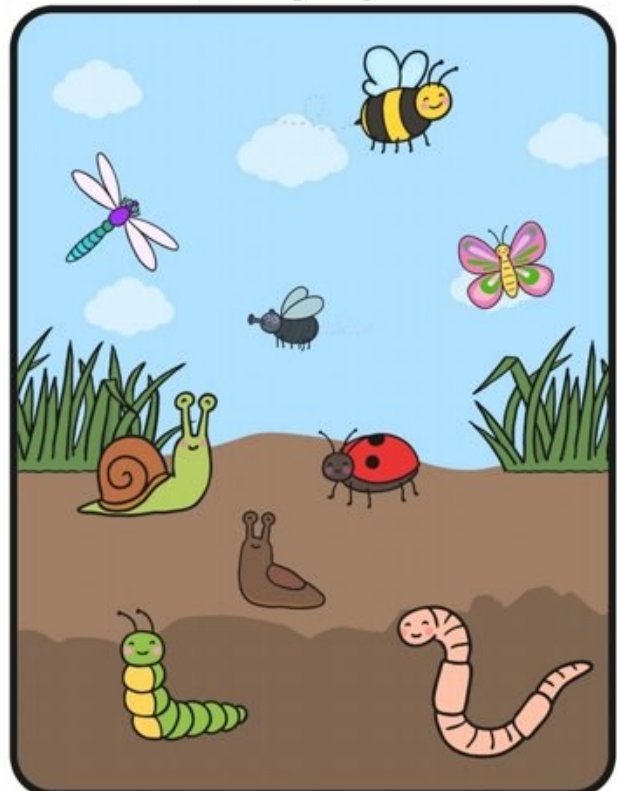
