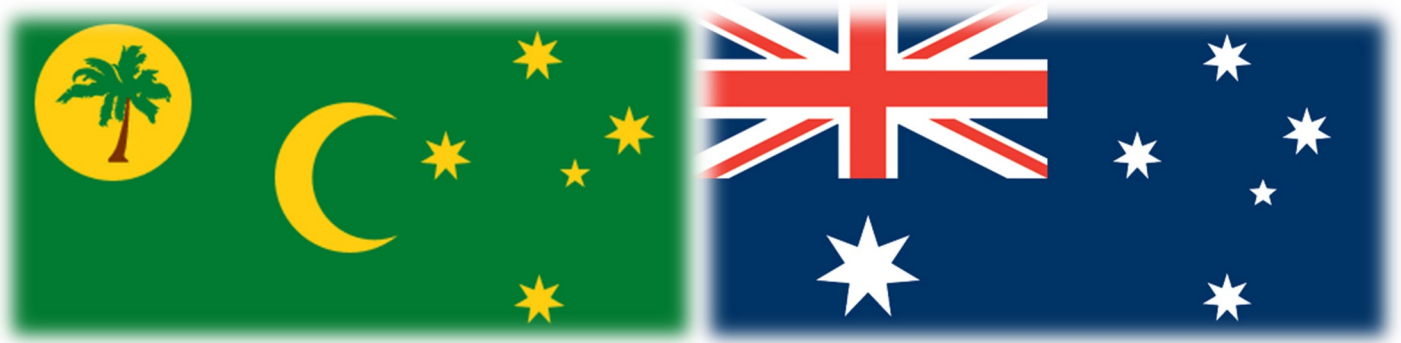

Act of Self Determination Day Celebration (ASDD) – 7th of May 2022



From the moment I began planning this event and included the many community groups and dedicated volunteers I was inundated by people wanting something different. Starting up conversations and inviting me to try and look at it from their perspective. I didn't expect that the event was well received, friendly, welcoming, engaging, but it made me happy that everyone that attended felt like they were part of a community.

During the event I learned that people were also willing to look after others when they needed help, even when they didn't know them. They interpreted and shared the Cocos Malay Culture. The tourists even brushed up on their Indonesian of “*Enak*” and “*Bagus Sekali*”. At the end of the day no one wanted anyone to have a bad time or to even go home on the ferry.

I was blown away by the carefree vibes. I happily watched the traditional and Scottish dancing, listened intently to the unique Cocos sounds collaborating of the skills of the new generation and the old, I encouraged visitors to taste and sample so many local Cocos Malay foods that was on offer by community members. And it was all offered freely and with a smile.

Jukung racing on this day is one of the event activities that is true to the Cocos Malay tradition. You need to be part of the race crew to fully appreciate its raw power, the hard work that goes into racing and its unpredictability! Jukung racing is an absolute great bonding experience for the two communities.

You hear “ASDD” and one would assume that the culture part is the sole event. While it's certainly an important aspect of the experience, there is so much more to see and do. From my community events experience we have only just scratched the surface together that perhaps someone from outside can add more value to it and create a whole new experience.

It might not have been the large-scale comprehensive affair given the incredibly effort from the local individuals that volunteered under which it was forged, the 2022 Act of Self Determination celebrations nonetheless delivered a very special programme and some deeply moving history that will stick in the minds of those who came for a long time to come.

REMINDER! Indian Ocean Territories (IOT) Marine Parks Grants Closing soon!

Just a quick reminder that the \$2.2 million Indian Ocean Territories (IOT) Marine Parks Grants are now open and will now close on the 23rd June.

Now is your chance to put together a grant application for a project that will enhance the protection, promotion and understanding of the new Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands marine parks and support local engagement, employment and economic opportunities.

These Grants are an exciting way for communities to directly participate in the management of the new IOT Marine Parks.

If you have a great idea for a project and are not an eligible entity, seek out an organisation who is eligible and who might be interested in working with you.

As a guide, some ideas for projects include:

- Managing threats such as marine debris and/or water quality
- Helping tourists and locals to experience the marine parks
- Research and monitoring projects
- Documenting cultural knowledge and history of the IOT marine environment
- Engaging the community in managing the marine parks
- Increasing understanding, appreciation, protection and promotion of the marine parks (for example, education programs, interpretive displays, events and festivals)
- Fishing industry programs or tools.

The IOTHS delivers a primary and acute health care service in two of Australia’s most remote and most spectacular settings - Christmas Island (CI) and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands (CKI). The IOTHS includes a 24 hour eight bed hospital and primary care facility on CI and clinics on Home and West Islands in the CKI. The IOTHS is committed to “Working with our communities to keep us healthy for the whole of our lives”.

The key responsibilities of the NUM are to lead and manage high quality health service provision for the community of CKI using a multi-disciplinary and culturally appropriate approach. The NUM plays a key role in the IOTHS leadership team and is responsible for ensuring the effective use of human and material resources within a robust clinical governance framework.

Our ideal applicant will be an experienced leader and manager and will have a primary health care approach, cross cultural experience in a rural or remote environment, emergency experience, and the ability to work within a multicultural and multi-disciplinary team.

Do I need to have both the influenza vaccine and the COVID-19 vaccine?

Yes, influenza and COVID-19 are caused by different viruses and so need different vaccines. It is recommended to get the influenza vaccine in readiness for the influenza season. This will minimise the possibility of contracting both influenza and COVID-19 infection at the same time and provide greater protection during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Why do I need the influenza vaccination if I have had all my COVID-19 vaccinations?

Influenza and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses, but they are caused by **different** viruses. So, they need different vaccines.

Studies show that patients who receive the COVID-19 and influenza vaccines on the same day, is safe and produces a good immune response to protect from both COVID-19 and influenza

The people who are at the highest risk of complications from getting the flu, are funded for free immunisations.

They are:

- persons 65 years or older
- children 6 months to less than 5 years
- primary school-aged children (from 5 years to students in year 6)
- pregnant women (any trimester)
- individuals 6 months and older with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza

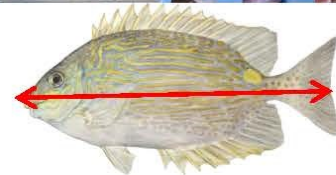

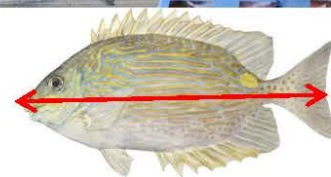

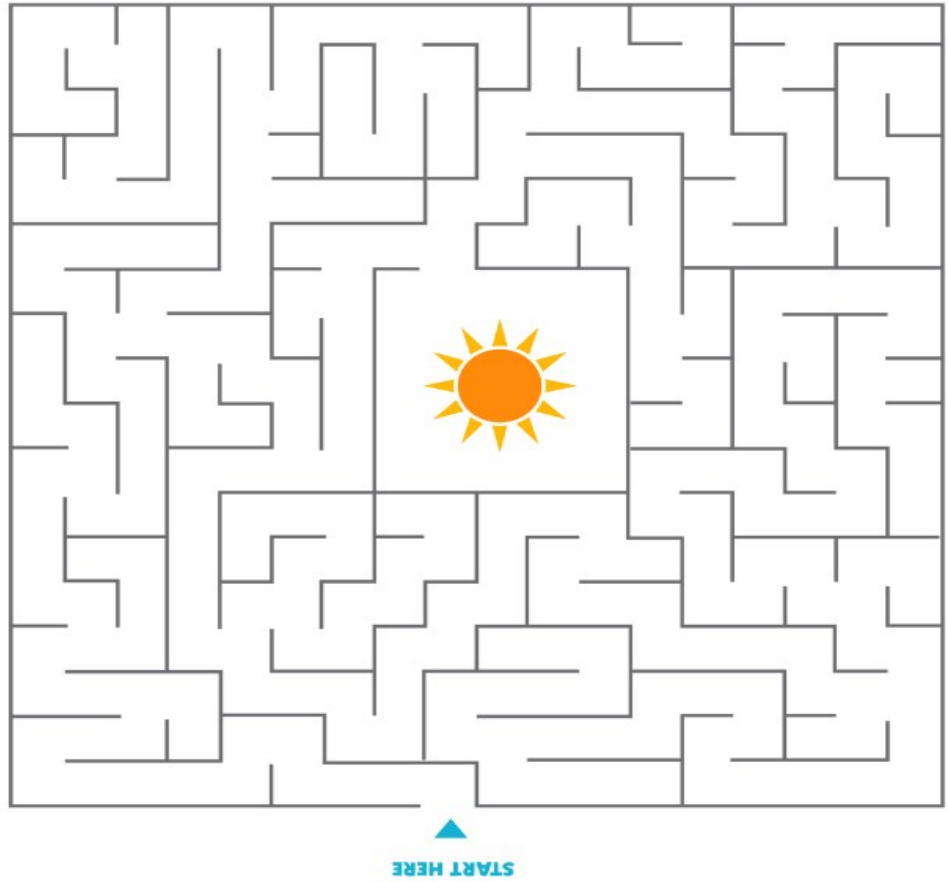
