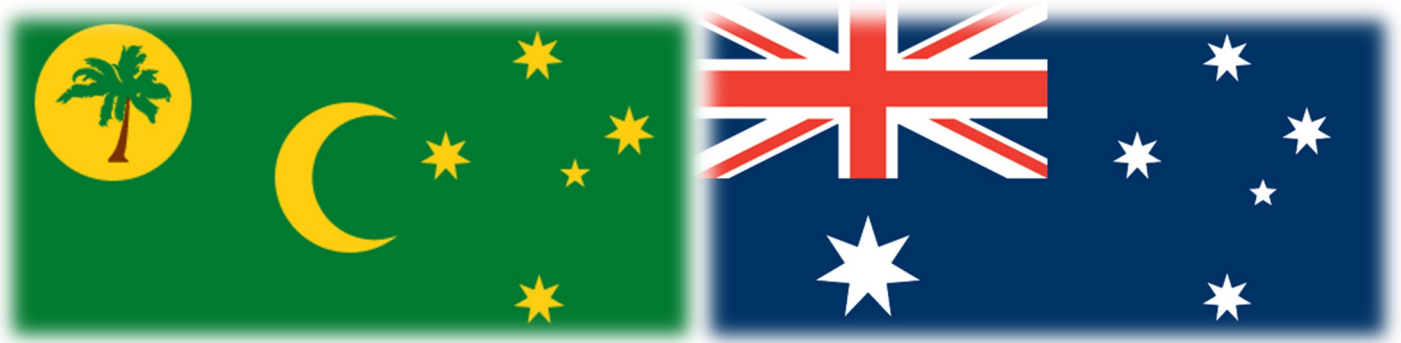


# “THE ATOLL” COMMUNITY NEWSLETTER

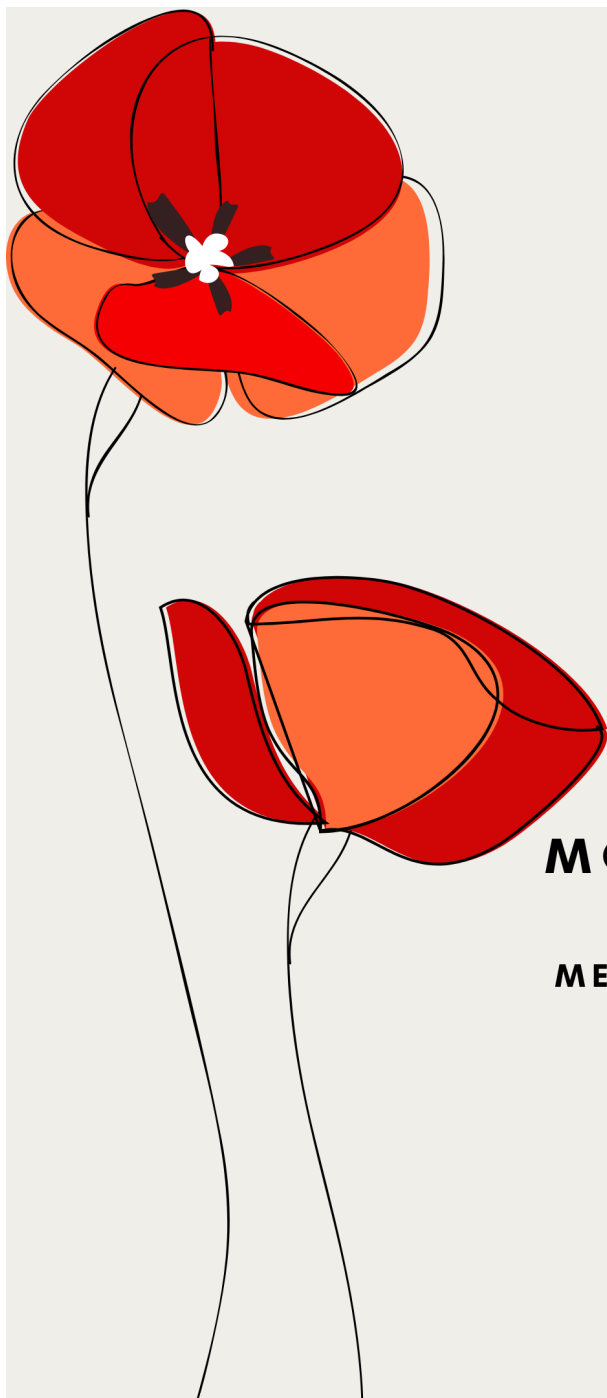

## Sentencing V – what penalties can a court give you for Commonwealth criminal offences?

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

This is the fifth article about sentencing (where a court gives you a penalty) when you are convicted (found guilty) of a criminal offence.

In this article and the next we will look at some of the penalties that the court can give you for Commonwealth offences.

The types of sentences that the court can give you for Commonwealth offences are different in some ways from those for state-based offences.

### Some guiding principles

The law says that when a court is deciding what penalty to give you for a Commonwealth offence, it must give you a penalty that is appropriate, thinking about all of the circumstances of the offence.

The court must take into account lots of factors. These include the type of offence and the circumstances of the offence, any other offences you have committed, the victim’s circumstances, any injury or damage you caused, whether you have pleaded guilty, your character, any previous criminal history you have, your age, financial situation and physical or mental conditions and whether you can be rehabilitated. There are other factors.

### No conviction

This is where even though you committed (are guilty of) the offence the court either:

- dismisses your charge or
- puts you on a good behaviour bond

without giving you a conviction. This means you have no criminal record for the offence.

It is very rare that the court can do this. The court must decide that due to your character, age, health, mental state or prior behaviour, or because the offence is trivial (not serious), or because there are mitigating circumstances (circumstances that lessen the seriousness of the offence) it is inappropriate (would not be proper) to give you a conviction.

If the court does not convict you and puts you on a good behaviour bond and you breach (break) the conditions of the bond the court can:

- take no action or
- convict you of the original offence and give you another sentence.

### Conviction and release on conditions (“recognizance release order”)

The court can convict you and release you on certain conditions (called a recognizance release order).

The conditions the court can make include that you:

- must be of good behaviour for a period up to 5 years
- pay compensation or reparation (pay for the harm you have caused)
- pay a fine
- comply with any other conditions that the court is allowed to give to you, for a period of up to 2 years. Other conditions include for example drug or alcohol counselling, or that you are released on probation for a period of up to 2 years.

If you are released on conditions, you are under the supervision of a probation officer, and must obey their directions. You cannot travel interstate or overseas without their written permission.

If you breach (break) any of the conditions of your recognizance release order the court can:

- take no action
- fine you up to 10 penalty units (a penalty unit is currently \$222) or
- cancel your recognizance release order and give you another sentence.

## Fine

This is a very common penalty. Many Commonwealth offences have a fine as the only sentencing option.

A fine penalty for Commonwealth offences is described in terms of penalty units, where one penalty unit is currently \$222.

When the court is deciding the amount of the fine you have to pay, it must take into account your ability to pay. But if the court has no information about your ability to pay, it can still give you a fine.

Where under a Commonwealth law the penalty is a term of imprisonment only, the law allows the court to give you a fine as well as, or instead of, the term of imprisonment. There is a formula for the court to calculate the maximum fine it can give you.

## A sentence of imprisonment – some general points

Commonwealth sentencing law says that a court cannot give you a sentence of imprisonment for a Commonwealth offence unless it has thought about all of the other sentencing options and decided no other option is appropriate in the circumstances of your offence. A common way of saying this is that “prison is the sentence of last resort.”

If you are convicted of a Commonwealth offence relating to money or property, and you have not been imprisoned before, and the monetary value is not more than \$2,000, the court usually cannot sentence you to imprisonment. It can only do so in exceptional circumstances.

In the next article, we will look more closely at sentences of imprisonment. We will also look at other sentencing options.

## Hukuman V – hukuman apa yang boleh di berikan mahkamah untuk kesalahan kriminal Komanwel?

Ini adalah artikel pendek tentang perkara undang-undang yang mungkin menarik untuk anda. Ini bukan nasihat undang-undang. Anda mesti selalu mendapatkan nasihat undang-undang sendiri untuk keadaan anda.

Ini adalah artikel kelima tentang hukuman (di mana mahkamah kasi anda hukuman) apabila anda dihukum (didapati bersalah) atas kesalahan kriminal.

Dalam artikel ini dan seterusnya kami akan melihat beberapa hukuman yang boleh diberikan oleh mahkamah kepada anda untuk kesalahan Komanwel.

Jenis hukuman yang boleh diberikan oleh mahkamah kepada anda untuk kesalahan Komanwel berbeza dalam beberapa hal dengan kesalahan mengikut negara.

## Beberapa prinsip bimbingan

Undang-undang mengatakan bahawa ketika mahkamah memutuskan hukuman apa yang akan diberikan kepada anda untuk kesalahan Komanwel, ia mesti memberi anda hukuman yang pantas, dengan mempertimbangkan semua keadaan kesalahan itu.

Mahkamah harus mempertimbangkan banyak faktor. Ini termasuk jenis kesalahan dan keadaan kesalahan, apa-apa kesalahan lain yang anda lakukan, keadaan mangsa, setiap cedera atau kerosakan yang ada disebabkan, sama ada anda telah mengaku bersalah, karakter anda, sebarang kesalahan sebelumnya yang anda ada, umur anda, keadaan keuangan dan keadaan fizikal atau mental dan sama ada anda boleh disembuhkan. Terdapat faktor lain.

## Tidak ada hukuman

Walaupun anda melakukan kesalahan (bersalah atas) hukuman, disinilah mahkamah akan:

- menolak tuduhan anda atau
- meletakkan anda kepada ikatan tingkah laku yang baik

tanpa memberi anda hukuman. Ini bermaksud anda tidak memiliki rekod kriminal untuk kesalahan tersebut.

Jarang sekali mahkamah boleh melakukan ini. Mahkamah mesti memutuskan bahawa karena karakter, umur, kesehatan, kondisi mental atau tingkah laku anda sebelumnya, atau karena kesalahan tidak serius, atau karena terdapat keadaan yang meringankan (keadaan yang mengurangkan keseriusan kesalahan) tidak pantas untuk memberi hukuman.

## Seterusnya...

Jika mahkamah tidak menghukum anda dan meletakkan anda kepada ikatan tingkah laku yang baik dan anda melanggar (melanggar) syarat ikatan itu mahkamah boleh:

- Tidak mengambil Tindakan atau
- menghukum anda atas kesalahan asal dan memberikan anda satu lagi hukuman.

### Hukuman dan pembebasan dengan syarat (“perintah pelepasan pengakuan”)

Mahkamah boleh menghukum dan membebaskan anda dengan syarat tertentu (dipanggil perintah pelepasan pengakuan).

Syarat yang boleh dibuat oleh mahkamah termasuk anda:

- harus berkelakuan baik untuk tempoh hingga 5 tahun
- bayar kompensasi atau ganti rugi (membayar kerugian yang anda telah lakukan)
- bayar denda
- Mematuhi sebarang syarat lain yang dibenarkan mahkamah berikan kepada anda, untuk tempoh sehingga 2 tahun. Syarat lain termasuk contohnya kaunseling drug atau alkohol, atau anda dibebaskan dalam masa probation untuk tempoh sehingga 2 tahun.

Jika anda dibebaskan dengan syarat, anda berada di bawah pengawasan probation opisa, dan harus mematuhi arahan mereka. Anda tidak boleh pergi kemana-mana tanpa surat kebenaran dari mereka.

Jika anda melanggar mana-mana syarat perintah pelepasan pengakuan anda mahkamah boleh:

- tidak ambil tindakan
- denda anda sehingga 10 unit penalti (satu unit penalty pada masa ini ialah \$222) atau
- batalkan perintah pelepasan pengakuan anda dan beri anda hukuman lain.

## Denda

Ini adalah hukuman yang sangat biasa. Banyak kesalahan Komanwel memiliki denda sebagai satu-satunya pilihan hukuman.

Denda untuk kesalahan Komanwel dijelaskan dalam unit penalti, di mana satu unit penalti saat ini adalah \$222.

Apabila mahkamah memutuskan jumlah denda yang anda perlu bayar, ia harus memperhitungkan kemampuan anda untuk membayar. Tetapi jika mahkamah tidak mempunyai maklumat tentang kemampuan anda untuk membayar, ia masih boleh memberi anda denda.

Di mana di bawah undang-undang Komanwel hukuman adalah dikurung sahaja, undang-undang membenarkan mahkamah memberi anda denda jugak, atau sebagai gantinya, hukuman dikurung. Ada formula unuk mahkamah mengira denda yang paling besar yang boleh diberikan kepada anda.

## Hukuman dikurung – beberapa perkara umum

Undang-undang hukuman Komanwel mengatakan bahawa mahkamah tidak boleh memberi anda hukuman penjara atas kesalahan Komanwel kecuali telah memikirkan pilihan hukuman lain dan memutuskan tidak ada pilihan lain yang sesuai dalam keadaan kesalahan anda. Cara biasa untuk mengatakan ini ialah “dikurung adalah hukuman pilihan terakhir.”

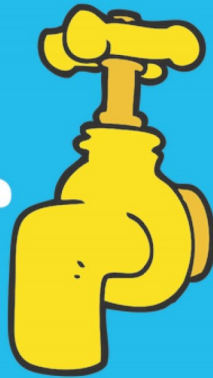
Jika anda dihukum karena kesalahan Komanwel yang berkaitan dengan uang atau harta, dan anda tidak pernah dikurung sebelum ini, dan nilai uangnya tidak lebih dari \$2,000, mahkamah biasanya tidak boleh menjatuhkan hukuman dikurung kepada anda. Ia hanya boleh berbuat dalam keadaan luar biasa.

Dalam artikel seterusnya, kami akan melihat dengan lebih dekat pada hukuman kurung. Kamu juga akan melihat pilihan hukuman lain.

### Make A Paper Poppy

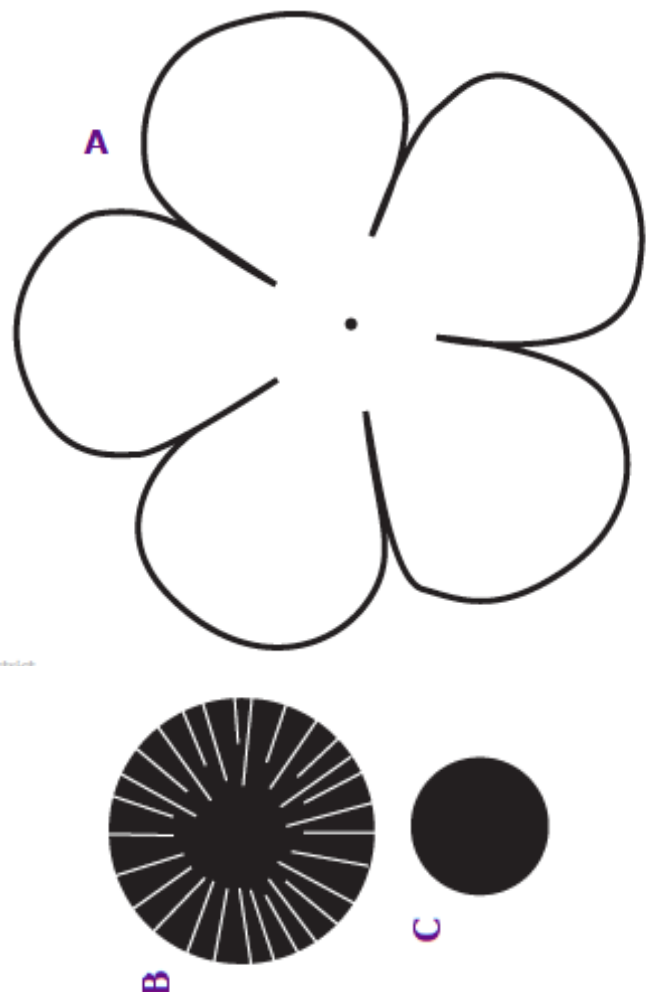
Step 1) Colour in your poppy head (A) in red.

What were you doing before?

I was working at Cocos Islands District High School as an Education Assistant in the High School. Loved it 😊

What are you doing now?

I am currently the Coordinator for Community Development with the Shire.

What is your biggest accomplishment?

The main one that sticks out is volunteering my time in all aspect of community services on Cocos. I am currently a member of the Cocos Marine Care, a community organisation that assists the community in protecting our fisheries stock and secures a valuable asset for future generations.

I once lost my way on North Keeling while assisting the Park Ranger undertaking counting birds in the transect. Such a surreal feeling, he was there beside me counting and next minute...gone! I have heard stories about weird happenings on the island but when it happens to you it's a whole new experience. That was in 1995.

I am passionate about mentoring and breaking the mold. I am always trying to better myself as a person, a father, a community member, doesn't usually work but do or do not there is no try! I also love working in remote areas in WA with the local indigenous community where their family dynamics is very comparable to the Cocos Malay. I enjoy the red dirt as much as the ocean. I love the road trips.

If you could change Cocos, what would you do first?

If I had the wealth, I would invest and disperse our community across all the islands in the southern atoll. I think people need the space to grow as a family unit, room to breathe without the sense of being arbitrated and fully appreciate our islands natural surroundings and become more mindful.

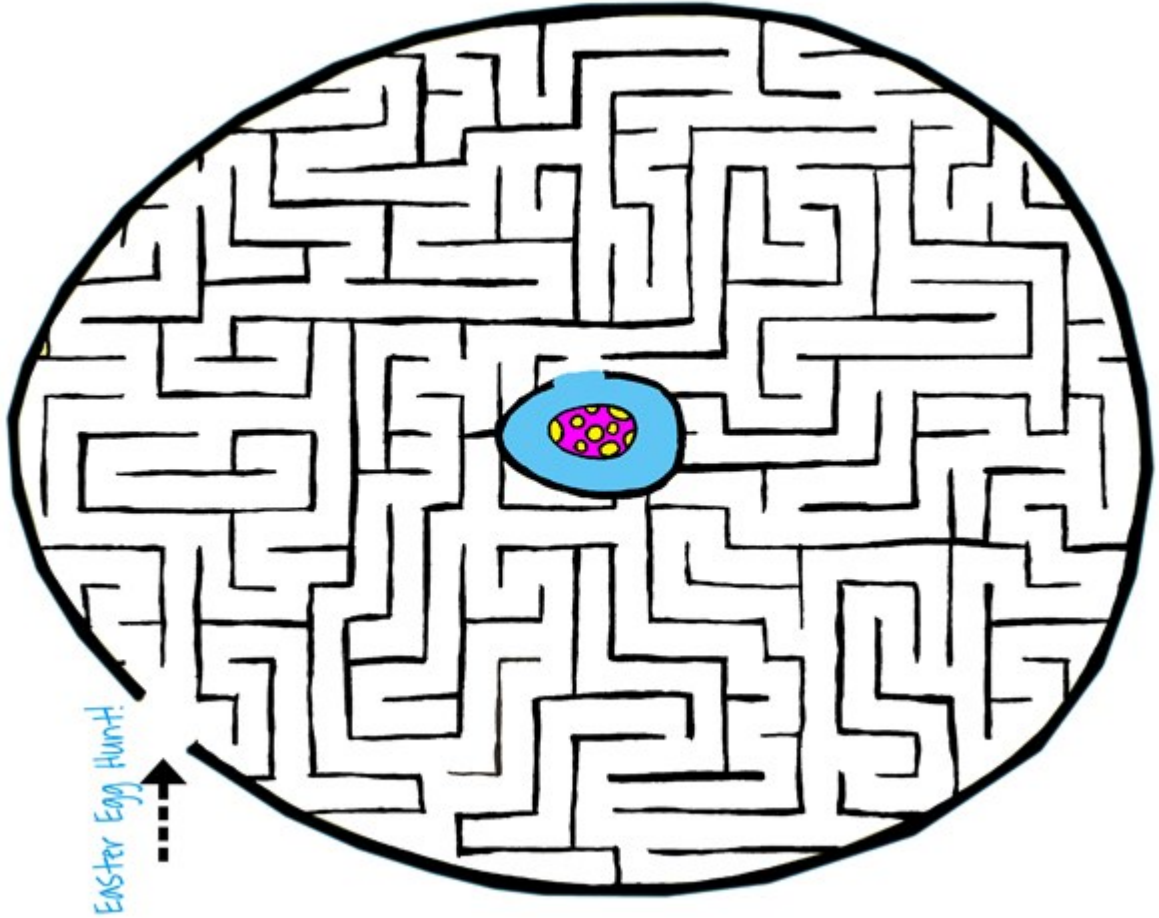
