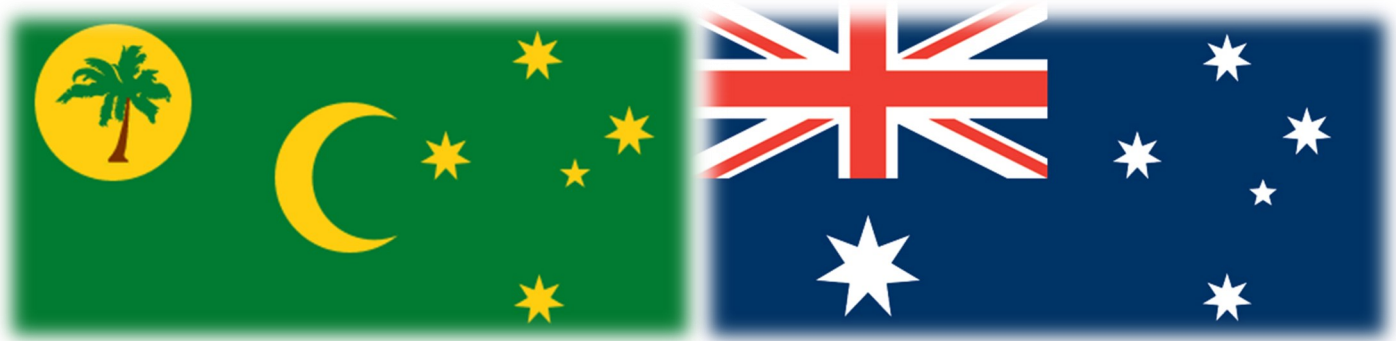

Viva Energy would like to thank those community members who attended our engagement meetings on West Island and Home Island on Friday 14 January 2022. During the meetings Viva Energy representatives apologised for and addressed the issues leading to the unleaded petrol stock-out situation. Importantly, we provided an update on the next delivery and our improved approach to supplying the island going forward.

In summary, the discussion covered how the supply chain currently works and what is involved in getting fuel to Australia's most remote community. This topic covered an overview of who manages the Premium Unleaded Petrol (PULP) storage assets on West Island (which is managed by Viva Energy) and Home Island (which is managed by the local Co-op) who owns the assets and manages their stocks; the current Shipping schedule (managed by Zentner) and how we plan deliveries based on seven voyages per annum, with the shipping route covering Christmas Island (CI), Cocos Keeling Island (CKI) and Singapore. Viva Energy currently orders stock for each voyage to ensure a regular and steady supply under normal operating and demand conditions.

We also had the opportunity to cover the issues that have impacted supply to the island and resulted in the current stock out situation including the challenges with shipping, cyclones/weather, difficulties unloading at CI, urgent maintenance being required on a tank used to transport fuel and then the ongoing and untimely delays at Fremantle Port due to industrial action and wharf constraints.

Despite these issues, our review of the stocks situation at the end of November on West Island showed we had more than enough supply cover until the next ship, which was scheduled for 28 December 2021. Unfortunately, panic buying depleted all stocks on West Island within two weeks and with the Zentner ship now being delayed by one month, fuel re-supply is now expected around end January 2022.

The team also discussed the range of interim options that Viva Energy had been considering to get fuel to island and also our future plans to mitigate any future supply issues. The options Viva Energy has worked on included:

- Drumming fuel and delivering by chartering a freight aircraft – this option had to be called off due to dangerous goods regulations and licencing requirements.
- Options to divert the Zentner ship to resupply CKI on its southward journey from Singapore to Fremantle.
- Options with Fremantle Port Authority to bring berthing forward but due to port congestion and lack of wharf and transport staff this was not possible.
- The Viva energy team were able to access 700L of PULP from the base of the tank in order to ensure the Australia Federal Police (AFP) and emergency response requirements were serviced until the Zentner ship arrives.
- Viva Energy have increased the size of the fuel delivery on the next ship. There will be 4-5 months stock arriving to island at end January 2022.
- Going forward, our intention is to maintain higher stock holdings on island with the use of an extra ISO tank in circulation.
- We will make fuel available to the public as soon as possible after the Zentner ship arrives and will communicate this via the Facebook page. The initial access may come with some buying constraints to ensure everyone is able to replenish their requirements.
- We encourage the community to return to normal purchasing habits to avoid unnecessarily depleting stocks outside of normal demand patterns.

For those commercial businesses that have been impacted by this situation, we are working with Rik Soderlund from Cocos Keeling Islands to understand genuine claims for compensation and will consider these in due course. Please contact Rik at marketing@cocoskeelingislands.com.au.

Viva Energy ingin mengucapkan terima kasih kepada komuniti yang menghadiri mesyuarat kami di West Island dan Home Island pada hari Jumaat 14 Januari 2022. Semasa mesyuarat itu, wakil Viva Energy memohon maaf dan menerangkan isu yang membawa kepada perkara kehabisan stok minyak petrol. Yang penting, kami menyediakan kabar terkini mengenai penghantaran seterusnya dan pendekatan kami yang lebih baik untuk membekalkan minyak di Pulu pada masa hadapan.

Ringkasnya, perbincangan termasuk cara bekalan minyak berfungsi pada masa ini dan perkara yang terlibat dalam mendapatkan minyak kepada komuniti paling terpencil di Australia. Topik ini termasuk gambaran keseluruhan tentang pihak yang menguruskan aset simpanan Premium Unleaded Petrol (PULP) di West Island (yang diuruskan oleh Viva Energy) dan Home Island (yang diuruskan oleh Kongsu) yang memiliki aset dan menguruskan stok mereka; jadual Penghantaran kapal laut (diuruskan oleh Zentner) dan cara kami merancang penghantaran berdasarkan tujuh pelayaran kapal laut setahun, dengan laluan penghantaran termasuk Pulau Krismas (CI), Pulau Cocos Keeling (CKI) dan Singapura. Viva Energy kini mengodak stok untuk setiap pelayaran kapal laut untuk memastikan bekalan minyak tetap dan stabil di bawah keadaan operasi dan permintaan biasa.

Kami juga berpeluang untuk membincangkan isu-isu yang telah menghalang bekalan ke pulu dan mengakibatkan keadaan stok semasa kehabisan termasuk cabaran dengan perkapalan, siklon/cuaca, kesukaran menurunkan kargo di CI, maintainan penting yang diperlukan pada tangka minyak yang digunakan untuk membawak minyak dan kemudian delay yang berterusan dan tidak tepat pada masanya di Pelabuhan Fremantle disebabkan oleh tindakan perindustrian dan penghalangan di tempat perlabuan.

Walaupun terdapat isu-isu ini, review kami terhadap situasi stok minyak pada akhir November di West Island menunjukkan kami mempunyai lebih daripada mencukupi bekalan sehingga kapal laut seterusnya, yang dijadualkan pada 28 Disember 2021. Malangnya, pembelian panik menghabiskan semua stok minyak di West Island dalam tempoh dua minggu dan dengan kapal Zentner kini ditundah selama sebulan, bekalan semula minyak kini dijangka sekitar akhir Januari 2022.

Tim kami juga membincangkan pelbagai pilihan sementara yang Viva Energy telah pertimbangkan untuk menghantar minyak ke pulu dan juga rancangan masa depan kami untuk mengurangkan sebarang isu bekalan masa depan. Pilihan yang telah diusahakan oleh Viva Energy termasuk:

- Minyak dalam deram dan menghantar dengan menyewa kapal terbang kargo - pilihan ini terpaksa dibatalkan kerana peraturan barangan berbahaya dan keperluan lesen.
- Pilihan untuk mengalihkan kapal Zentner untuk membekalkan semula CKI dalam perjalanan ke selatan dari Singapura ke Fremantle.
- Pilihan dengan Pelabuhan Fremantle untuk membawa berlabuh ke hadapan tetapi disebabkan kesesakan pelabuhan dan kekurangan kakitangan di pelabuhan ini tidak dapat dilakukan.
- Tim Viva dapat mengakses 700L PULP dari dasar tangki untuk memastikan Polis Persekutuan Australia (AFP) dan keperluan emergensi diservis sehingga kapal Zentner tiba.
- Viva Energy telah meningkatkan saiz penghantaran minyak pada kapal laut seterusnya. Akan ada stok 4-5 bulan sampai ke pulu pada akhir Januari 2022.
- Menuju ke hadapan, niat kami adalah untuk mengekalkan pegangan stok yang lebih tinggi di pulu dengan penggunaan tangki ISO tambahan dalam edaran.
- Kami akan menyediakan minyak kepada orang ramai secepat mungkin selepas kapal Zentner tiba dan akan menyampaikannya melalui halaman Facebook. Akses awal mungkin datang dengan beberapa pelatoran pembelian untuk memastikan semua orang dapat mengisi semula keperluan mereka.
- Kami menggalakkan masyarakat untuk kembali kepada tabiat pembelian biasa untuk mengelakkan kehabisan stok yang tidak perlu di luar permintaan biasa.

Bagi bisnis-bisnis komersial yang telah terimpak oleh situasi ini, kami sedang bekerjasama dengan Rik Soderlund dari Cocos Keeling untuk memahami tuntutan kompensasi dan akan mempertimbangkan perkara ini dalam masa terdekat. Sila hubungi Rik di marketing@cocoskeelingislands.com.au.

To be considered, applicants must possess an unrestricted Electrical Workers Licence (WA). The key responsibilities of the Leading Hand Electrician / Technician are to support the Electrical Supervisor by providing on the job team leadership for allocated tasks; carry out controls, instrumentation and electrical maintenance and installation work at the Christmas Island Power Station; carry out electrical maintenance and installation work on the Christmas Island distribution network; fault finding and troubleshooting of electrical, instrumentation and control systems; maintain maintenance records in paper and computerised formats; and maintain a safe working environment at all times and comply with all IOTPS work procedures.

To be considered, applicants must possess an unrestricted Electrical Workers Licence (WA). How to put on your face mask

1) Clean hands with soap and water or alcohol-based rub.



2) Hold the mask by its tapes or loops, then tie the mask around your head or put the loops around your ears.



3) Make sure the mask covers your mouth and nose, and that there are no gaps between your face and the mask. Press the nose piece around your nose.



4) Do not touch the front of the mask while wearing it.



COVID-19

Use your face mask correctly



Ensure you remove your face mask correctly. Never leave it on you head, around your neck, under your nose or mouth or around your arm for later use.

Never touch or adjust your face mask without cleaning your hands both before and after.

Never re-use single-use masks.

Cloth masks should be washed each day after use, or when wet or visibly dirty. Masks can be washed in the washing machine (preferably at 60 degrees C) with other clothes. Dry the cloth mask in the clothes dryer or in fresh air before you re-use it. Clean your hands with soap and water or alcohol-based hand rub after handling used face masks.

Please refer to community advice and the HealthyWA website for updates about when and how to use face masks.

How to take off your face mask

1) Avoid touching the front of the mask. Only touch the ear loops or tapes.



2) Take the mask off from behind your head by pulling the tapes or loops straight forward and moving the mask away from your face. Do not touch the front of the mask.



3) Throw the mask in the bin or if using a fabric face mask place in washing machine.



4) Clean your hands with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand rub.



Bagaimana memakai mask anda



1) Cucuk tangan dengan sabun dan ayer atau cucukan tangan yang mengandungi alkohol.

Pastikan anda mencabut mask dengan pantas. Jangan pernah ditinggalkan dikepala anda, dileher, dibawa hidung atau mulut anda ataupun ditangan anda untuk digunakan lagi.

Jangan pernah menahan atau membetulkan mask anda tanpa menyucik tangan anda dahulu dan selepasnya.

Jangan pernah guna kembali mask yang khas untuk digunakan sekali sahaja.

Mask yang kain harus dicucuk setiap hari selepas dipakai, atau bila basah atau kelihatan kotor. Mask boleh dicucuk dalam mesin menyucik (sebaiknya dalam 60 degrees C) dengan pakaian lain. Green Living Tips

You can reduce number of environmentally harsh and toxic chemicals used around your home by replacing the with more earth friendly, cheap and common substances such as a vinegar. Here are a bunch of handy vinegar tips to get you start.

Note: spot test before going all out with any of cleaning related tips.

- To remove calcium buildup on kettles and electric jugs, boil the kettle with half a cup of white vinegar and leave to soak for a while. Rinse with fresh water, reboil and drained the boiled water. Your kettle should be calcium free.
- A half cup of vinegar added to the toilet bowl left overnight removes bowl odour. The smell of the vinegar will also dissipate overnight.
- Vinegar can be used as a benchtop disinfectant but it's a good idea to wipe over at night in order for the smell dissipates
- Vinegar can be used as a fabric softner by adding half the amount of vinegar as you would of your usual softener.
- Pour boiling white vinegar down clogged drain to remove obstruction.
- Vinegar can also be used as a glass cleaner either mixed with water or used neat in a spray bottle.
- Use 50/50 vinegar and water to clean your iron. Add the mixture to your iron and allow it steam itself clean.

How to Make Your Own Liquid Laundry Soap.

This laundry soap doesn't create suds, but it doesn't need to in order to get your laundry clean.

What You Need

- 1 cup Dr. Bronner's pure castile or any liquid soap
- 1 cup baking soda
- 2 cups of water
- 1/3 cup of salt

Instructions

Warm the water and mix with salt and baking soda until dissolved. Pour into a 1litre container or reuse empty laundry detergent bottle. Add the Dr. Bronners's liquid soap or any liquid soap and fill the reminder of the container with water. Use 1/4 cup of laundry soap per load.

Have you got any advice that you would like to share?

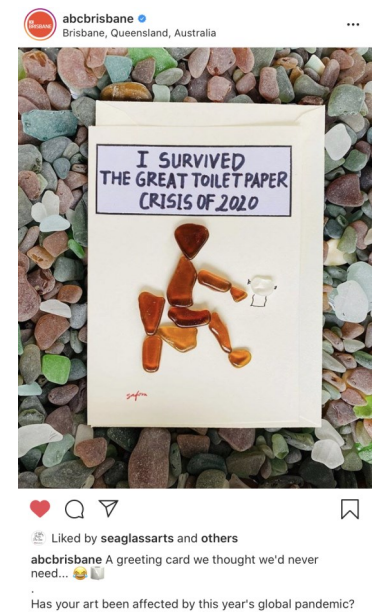
I don't really have advice to share but I have a poem about seaglass from the beachcombing magazine that I would love to share for the community.
