Proposed Disposition of Property "Big Barge Art Centre" Part Lot 100, Sydney Highway, West Island

In accordance with Section 3.58 (3) and (4) of the *Local Government Act 1995 (WA) (CKI)*, Council is required to give public notice of any disposition of property. This includes selling, leasing, or otherwise disposing of, whether absolutely or not.

Council resolved at its March 2015 ordinary meeting to enter into a Lease Agreement with Ms Emma Washer for Part Lot 100 West Island for a period of 10 years with a 10 year option.

This portion of land has been valued at \$3,900/annum and the Lessee will be required to pay this amount as well as annual CPI increases and the assessed annual Council Rates set from year to year.

Council invites written submissions from residents regarding the proposed disposition with submissions closing on Friday, 15th of May 2015 marked confidential and addressed to the undersigned.





Fish for the future

Fisheries fun facts

Under a Service Delivery Agreement with the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development, The Department of Fisheries WA (DoF) manages commercial fishing, recreational fishing and aquaculture activities at the Indian Ocean Territories (IOTs).

Since 2006, DoF has conducted research on commercial, recreational and iconic fish species, as well as fish habitats and invertebrates. Results of this research can be found at www.fish.wa.gov.au/IOTs

DoF would like to share the research results and some *Fun Facts* on species found at the IOTs with the community. Watch this space!

Squaretail coral trout inhabit coral reefs and studies have shown that although they move around considerably within a single reef, they often don't move more than ~500m away from their home. One of the only times a coral trout may move away from its reef, is during spawning time, when they aggregate at dusk, making it difficult for predators to see and feed upon eggs. As coral trout aggregate, males try to entice females into their territories with elaborate courtship displays. The male will approach close to the female with his body tilted at 45° to 90° and shake his body and head from side to side. If the female likes what she sees, spawning rushes occur after this courtship behaviour.

The fastest period of growth in coral trout occurs in the first three years of life. The average daily growth of newly settled juveniles has been measured at 0.81per day, meaning they reach close to 14in the first 6 months.

Adult coral trout feed on a variety of reef fish such as damselfish and they even eat juveniles of their own species!



Recent research surveys have shown that adult Squaretail coral trout at the Cocos (Keeling) are in very low numbers.

Squaretail coral trout tinggal dibatu karang dan penyelidikkan telah menunjukkan yang walaupun mereka bergerak kelilingan, mereka biasa tidak bergerak lebih dari ~500m dari tempat tinggal mereka. Salahsatu masa yang mereka memindah tempat, ialah masa lepas telor, bila mereka berkumpul dimasa fajar, membuat susah untuk binatang lain melihat dan memakan telor mereka. Bila mereka berkumpul, lelaki coba menarik perempuannya kedalam tempatnya dengan pertunjukkan pertunangan. Lelakinya akan mendatangi dekat dengan perempuan dengan badannya disuaian 45° hingga 90° dan mengetar badan dan kepalanya dari lambung kelambung. Jika perempuannya suka apa yang dilihat, bibitnya dibuat dimasa pertunangan ini.

Masa paling cepat coral trout membesar ialah tiga tahun pertama kehidupannya. Biasanya anak-anak jenis ini telah diukur membesar 0.81 setiap hari, bermakna mereka dekat-dekat 14in dalam 6 bulan pertama.

Coral trout yang dewasa memakan berbagai ikan dikarang seperti damselfish dan mereka juga memakan anak-anak ikan jenis mereka sendiri!

Healthy Living Tips

Home remedy for mosquito bites

- Garlic-One of the quickest and easiest remedies for those terrible mossie bites is a simple clove of garlic. Cut a clove in half and rub it directly onto the bite. This will relieve the itching almost immediately and is safe to use on children and adults.
- Home Made Calamine Lotion-Mix baking soda with water to make a smooth paste. Rub the paste over the mosquito bites. This will stop the itch and works just like calamine lotion. Of course if you have calamine lotion in your medicine chest use that as it really works well on mossie bites.
- Salt-A little salty water is good.
 Make it up with a small amount of water to a teaspoon of salt. Dab it on the bite but do not dry with a towel. The water will dry but the salt residue will remain to stop the tiching. A swim in the sea will give the same result if you are near a beach.
- Aloe Vera-You may not have Aloe Vera plant growing in your cupboard, but you could get one in a pot on your window shelf or grow them in the garden. Aloe vera is a fabulous, versatile, natural remedy for all bites, sunburn and scratches. Simply break a little piece from the plant and rub it on the bite or infected area.
- Other natural remedies that you can apply to bites are lemon juice, lime juice or other citrus juices that taste bitter. The inside of banana peel. Cider vinegar or white vinegar.

It is always best to put something on mosquito bites and sandfly bites for children. Children don't know the meaning behind telling them not to scratch the bites and there is always a danger of the bite becoming infected because of scratching.

Community Invitation

It's on again this year, how many kilometers can you ride over 21 days in May? It's easy, just create your own team made up of family, friends or work colleagues (on island or off island) for a chance to increase your fitness, or just to enjoy a challenge. This year a minimum of 2 riders/team or a maximum of 6 riders/team are permitted.

How it all works

Stages (Rides)

There are many day and evening (indoor) stages, far more than the Giro d'Italia or Le Tour de France as they only have 21 stages in total. We have 46 stages with some new stages on Direction Island and Home Island. Don't be alarmed though, you don't have to do all the stages.

The indoor evening stages are on training rollers, consisting of; 1km, 3km, 5km, 7km, 10km, 50km and the entertaining 100km Team Challenge, where teams battle it out changing riders at any time. The outdoor stages consist of laps around the 'village' to numerous jetty and back rides with a few cross country island loop rides. More about the stages on the website or Facebook.

Riders

Participating riders can select any stage that suits their level of fitness, or to boost their teams points and kms just compete in more stages. Stages vary from indoor evening rides on training rollers, to outdoors. Riders may like to cruise and enjoy one of the many short scenic rides that take place outdoors around the island, these are called Flexi Rides, just place the results on the daily white board at the club after each ride beside your team and they will be uploaded to the team leader board each evening, with results available the following morning on the website, facebook or the official TDC noticeboards at Dorys Café, the Club and Supermarket.

Flexi Rides

This is a creative and non competitive option. It's designed for participants to ride at their own pace and in their own time. Suggested routes will be offered for each day of the tour, but these are not compulsory. Participants just record distance travelled and time on the results board at the club after each ride, or email the results through. If you want more technical tracking and recording then try a gps system that's cycling compatible, upload these stats to Stava under Cocos Cycling Club and we will extract them from there...

Points

Points are awarded in the fun classifications. Youth (pink and blue jersey), Adults and Youth (green jersey) and for the over 50's (grey jersey).

Duration

The 2015 tour is held over 3 weeks commencing Saturday 9th May.

Insurance






