





Investigating deep sea-life in the Indian Ocean Territories Menyelidiki kehidupan laut dalam di Indian Ocean Territories

From around 13 to 17 October a large high tech looking ship will be visible around Cocos. This will be the CSIRO research vessel (RV) *Investigator*. Marine scientists from around Australia are on-board as part of a 35-day voyage to explore the marine area around Cocos (Keeling) Islands. The scientists and technicians on board will be mapping the seafloor and surveying the sea-life that lives at great depths in this part of the Indian Ocean.

RV *Investigator* is part of the Marine National Facility, which is operated by CSIRO, Australia's national science agency. It's 94 metres long and 9 stories high. The big white dome above the bridge measures atmosphere conditions and the smaller ones are for internet and radio communications. The A-frame at the rear of the boat is to lower cameras and other research equipment into the water. On board are 52 crew, technicians and scientists from all around the country.

Dari sekitar 13 hingga 17 Oktober sebuah kapal besar kelihatan berteknologi tinggi akan terlihat di sekitar Cocos. Ini adalah kapal research CSIRO (RV) *Investigator*. Saintis marin dari seluruh Australia ada di kapal sebagai bagian dari perjalanan selama 35 hari untuk menyelidiki kawasan laut sekitar Pulu Cocos. Saintis dan technicians di kapal akan membuat mapping bawah laut dan melihat kehidupan laut yang hidup di kedalam yang sangat dalam di bahagian Indian Ocean.

RV *Investigator* adalah bagian dari Marine National Facility, yang dijalankan oleh CSIRO, agensi sains kebangsaan Australia. Panjangnya 94 meter dan tingginya 9 tingkat. Dome putih yang besar di atas kapal mengukur keadaan udara dan yang lebih kecil adalah untuk internet dan radio. A-frame di bagian belakang kapal adalah untuk menurunkan gambar dan bekeras research yang lain ke dalam ayer. Ada 52 krew di kapal, technicians dan saintis dari seluruh negara.

My name is Tim O'Hara from Museums Victoria in Melbourne, and I am the chief scientist for this voyage. I am pretty excited to be exploring the waters around Cocos (Keeling) Islands. I had hoped to meet members of the community and provide an opportunity for people to come on board the ship, but unfortunately, the ship's COVID-19 protocols don't allow for this. I do hope to visit Cocos after the voyage to share research findings directly with the community.

We know from satellite measurements and historical geological expeditions that massive undersea mountains rise from the seafloor all around Cocos. Some of them are over 4 kilometres high and 70 km across. They were formed during the dinosaur era, up to 100 million years ago. There is one seamount about 150km to the southwest of Cocos that nearly reaches the surface – it will be a focus of our research after we leave Cocos itself. These underwater peaks were originally volcanos and many became islands at one point with their crater above the sea surface. But rocks that formed from the lava were very heavy, and so, once the volcanos stopped being active, they very slowly sank into the soft ocean floor. Many are now 1 to 2 km below the sea-surface. We are going to map many of these ancient underwater volcanos for the first time. Cocos (Keeling) Islands were formed in a similar way but molten rock under the ocean crust has kept sinking rates low enough for coral atolls to form on the seamount summits.

Nama saya Tim O'Hara dari Museums Victoria di Melbourne, dan saya adalah ketua saintis untuk pelayaran ini. Saya sangat gembira untuk menyelidiki lautan di sekitar Pulu Cocos. Tadinya saya berharap dapat bertemu dengan masyarakat dan memberi peluang kepada orang-orang untuk menaiki kapal, tapi sayangnya, protokol COVID-19 kapal tidak membenarkan. Saya berharap untuk melawat Cocos selepas pelayaran untuk berkongsi hasil penyeledikan dengan masyarakat.

Kami tahu dari pengukuran satelit dan sejarah ekspedisi geologis bahawa ada gunung-gunung bawah laut yang besar di sekitar Cocos. Berberapa di antaranya tinggi lebih dari 4 kilometer dan lebar 70 km. Ia terbentuk semasa era dinosaurus, hingga 100 juta tahun lalu. Ada satu gunung bawah laut sekitar 150km ke barat daya Cocos yang hampir timbul – itu akan menjadi fokus penyelidikan kami setelah kami meninggalkan Cocos. Puncak di bawah laut ini awalnya adalah gunung berapi dan banyak yang menjadi pulu pada satu ketika dengan craternya di atas permukaan laut. Tetapi batu yang terbentuk daripada lava sangat berat, dan oleh itu, begitu gunung berapi berhenti aktif, ia perlahan-lahan tenggelam ke dalam laut. Kebanyakannya sekarang berada 1 hingga 2 km di bawah laut. Kami akan mematakan banyak gunung berapi yang lama di bawah laut untuk pertama kali. Pulu Cocos terbentuk dengan cara yang sama tetapi molten rock di bawah lapisan tanah bawah laut membuat tingkat tenggelamnya cukup rendah untuk membentuk atol karang di puncak gunung bawah laut.



We expect these seamounts will be home to fascinating creatures like deep-sea coral and sponge gardens. There will probably be weird looking fish with huge fangs or with special organs that can produce their own light. We will be taking as many photos and videos as we can, so that people on Cocos and around Australia can see the special creatures that are hidden in these deep waters.

We are looking forward to connecting with Cocos school students and Cocos Marine Care via livestream during the voyage, and we want to thank the Parks Australia marine park team for providing funding to support this voyage.

Kami berharap gunung-gunung bawah laut ini akan menjadi tempat tinggal kepada binatang yang menarik seperti karang laut dan sponge gardens. Mungkin ada ikan yang nampak aneh dengan taring besar atau dengan organ khas yang boleh menghasilkan cahaya mereka sendiri. Kami akan mengambil gambar dan video sebanyak mungkin, supaya orang di Cocos dan sekitar Australia dapat melihat binatang khusus yang tersembunyi di perairan dalam ini.

Kami berharap dapat berhubung dengan anak sekolaan dan Cocos Marine Care melalui livestream semasa pelayaran, dan kami ingin berterima kasih kepada tim taman laut Parks Australia untuk menyediakan bantuan duit untuk menyokong pelayaran ini.

The voyage will provide new and fundamental knowledge of the deep-sea environment around Cocos to support management of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands Marine Park that the CKI community helped co-design during 2021.

The voyage has been made possible through a grant of sea-time on the *RV Investigator* by the CSIRO Marine National Facility. The research is being financially supported by Parks Australia and the Bush Blitz program of the Department of Energy, Climate Change, the Environment and Water. It is a national scientific collaboration with scientists participating from Museums Victoria, Australian Museum (Sydney), CSIRO, and Western Australian Museum.

What is bail? II

These are short articles about legal issues that may interest you. They are not legal advice. You should always get individual legal advice for your situation.

This is the second of four articles about bail. In this article we will look at what things the police or court must think about when deciding whether to give you bail or refuse you bail. We will look at when there must be “exceptional circumstances” for you to be given bail. We will also look at what a bail undertaking is and how you agree to it.

If you are refused bail you are not released back into the community but must stay in custody until your charge has been dealt with.

If you are an adult there is no automatic right for you to get bail. If you are a child there is a qualified right to bail, which means you have some rights related to bail.

What must the police or court consider when deciding whether to give you bail?

Some of the things that must be considered by the person deciding whether you can be given bail (the police or the court) are:

1. If the person making the decision thinks that you might:

- Not come to court when required
- Commit an offence
- Be a danger to anyone's safety or their welfare or property or
- Interfere with witnesses or the course of justice.

2. Whether you need to be kept in custody for your own safety.

3. Whether the prosecutor has given grounds for opposing bail.

4. Whether the proper conduct of the trial could be affected unless you are in custody during the trial.

5. Whether there are any conditions that can be put on your bail to make sure that you come to court when required and don't interfere with witnesses or to protect your safety or to address the prosecutor's opposition to you getting bail.

6. If you have been charged with an offence relating to a child, whether a condition can be put on your bail making you live elsewhere to where the child is living.

7. Whether the alleged offence is so serious that it is inappropriate to give you bail.

When the court or police are thinking about whether you might not come to court when required, or commit an offence, they must take into account these things:

- The seriousness of the offence or offences and how you might be sentenced if you are convicted.
- Your character, criminal history, who you associate with, your home environment, background, where you live and your financial position.
- The history of any other grants of bail to you (for example, have you complied with your bail before).
- The strength of the evidence against you.

The situations where you must show “exceptional circumstances” to be given bail

There are some situations where you have to show exceptional circumstances as to why you should not be refused bail and kept in custody.

These situations include:

1. If you are already on bail for a “serious” offence under the Bail Act, and you are then charged with another “serious” offence, you must show exceptional reasons as to why you should not be kept in custody.

“Serious” offences are:

- Those listed in a particular part of the Bail Act and
- Breaching (breaking) protective bail conditions (conditions on your bail designed to protect people).

So if you have already been charged with one of these serious offences and given bail, but you then commit and are charged with another of these serious offences, you will have to show exceptional circumstances as to why you should not be kept in custody until your charges are dealt with.

2. If you have been released from jail on “parole” (parole is where you are allowed to serve the rest of your jail sentence in the community) and you commit and are charged with one of the serious offences listed in the Bail Act.

3. If you have been charged with murder. Your application for bail can only be dealt with by a judge of the Supreme Court.

4. If you have been declared a serial family violence offender and you have been charged with a family violence offence. There is a definition of what a serial family violence offender is.

There are a few other situations where you must show exceptional reasons as to why you should be granted bail for an offence.

If you are given bail

If you are granted bail you must enter into a written undertaking (promise) to the court to come to court on the next and each court date, comply with any conditions on your bail and comply with any home detention bail conditions. You do this by signing the bail undertaking.

In the third article, we will look at the conditions that can be attached to your bail.

Apakah itu jaminan? II

Ini adalah artikel pendek mengenai perkara undang-undang yang mungkin menarik untuk anda. Ini bukan nasihat undang-undang. Anda mesti selalu mendapatkan nasihat undang-undang sendiri untuk keadaan anda.

Ini adalah artikel kedua dari empat artikel tentang jaminan. Dalam artikel ini kami akan melihat perkara yang polis atau mahkamah mesti fikirkan apabila memutuskan sama ada untuk kasi anda jaminan atau menolak jaminan. Kami akan melihat kapan harus ada “keadaan luar biasa” untuk anda dikasi jaminan. Kami juga akan melihat apa itu jaminan dan bagaimana anda menyentujunya.

Jika anda ditolak dengan jaminan anda tidak dibebaskan tetapi harus tetap berada dalam tahanan sampai tuduhan anda diselesaikan.

Jika anda sudah dewasa tidak ada hak otomatis bagi anda untuk mendapatkan jaminan. Jika anda seorang anak-anak ada hak yang memenuhi syarat untuk jaminan, yang berarti anda mempunyai beberapa hak yang berkaitan dengan jaminan.

Apakah yang harus di pertimbangkan oleh polis atau mahkamah ketika memutuskan apakah akan kasi anda jaminan?

Beberapa hal yang harus di pertimbangkan oleh orang yang memutuskan apakah anda boleh dikasi jaminan (polis atau mahkamah) adalah:

1. Jika orang yang membuat keputusan berfikir bahawa anda mungkin:
 - Tidak datang ke mahkamah bila diperlukan
 - Melakukan kesalahan
 - Menjadi bahaya kepada keselamat siapa pun atau keselamatan atau harta benda mereka atau Menganggu saksi atau menganggu keadilan.
2. Apakah anda perlu ditahan untuk keselamatan anda sendiri.
3. Apakah pihak pendakwa telah memberikan alasan untuk menentang jaminan.
4. Apakah perbicaraan mahkamah yang benar dapat terpengaruh kecuali anda berada dalam tahanan semasa perbicaraan mahkamah.
5. Apakah ada syarat yang boleh diberikan pada jaminan anda untuk memastikan anda datang ke mahkamah bila diperlukan dan tidak menganggu saksi atau untuk melindungi keselamatan anda atau untuk mengatasi tentangan pihak pendakwa terhadap anda mendapatkan jaminan.
6. Jika anda telah dituduh dengan kesalahan yang berkaitan dengan anak-anak, sama ada syarat boleh dikenakan dengan jaminan anda membuat anda tinggal di tempat lain di mana anak itu tinggal.
7. Apakah kesalahan yang di tuduh adalah sangat serius sehingga tidak pantas untuk kasi anda jaminan.

Apabila mahkamah atau polis memikirkan sama ada anda mungkin tidak datang ke mahkamah apabila diperlukan, atau melakukan kesalahan, mereka harus mempertimbangkan perkara yang berikut:

- Keseriusan Kesafahan dan bagaimana anda boleh dihukum jika anda terbukti bersalah.
- Sifat anda, sejarah kriminal, dengan siapa anda bergaul, suasana rumah anda, latar belakang, tempat tinggal anda dan keadaan keuangan anda.
- Sejarah sebarang pemberian jaminan lain kepada anda (contohnya, apakah anda telah memenuhi jaminan anda sebelum ini).
- Kekuatan bukti terhadap anda.

Keadaan di mana anda harus menunjukkan “keadaan luar biasa” untuk dikasi jaminan

Ada beberapa keadaan di mana anda harus menunjukkan keadaan luar biasa tentang mengapa anda tidak boleh ditolak dengan jaminan dan ditahan.

Keadaan ini termasuk:

1. Jika anda sudah dalam jaminan untuk kesalahan “serius” di bawah Undang-Undang Jaminan, dan anda kemudian di tuduh dengan kesalahan “serius” yang lain, anda harus menunjukkan alasan yang luar biasa mengapa anda tidak boleh ditahan.

Kesalahan “serius” adalah:

- Yang di lis dalam bagian tertentu dari Undang-Undang Jaminan dan
- Melanggar (melanggar) syarat jaminan perlindungan (syarat pada jaminan anda di buat untuk melindungi orang).

Jadi jika anda telah dituduh dengan salah satu kesalahan serius ini dan dikasi jaminan, tetapi kemudian anda melakukan dan dituduh dengan satu lagi kesalahan yg serius, anda harus tunjukkan keadaan luar biasa tentang mengapa anda tidak boleh ditahan sampai tuduhan anda diselesaikan.

2. Jika anda telah dibebaskan dari kurungan dengan “parole” (parole adalah di mana anda boleh menjalankan sisa hukuman kurung anda di luar) dan anda melakukan dan dituduh dengan salah satu kesalahan serius yang di lis di dalam Undang-Undang Jaminan.

3. Jika anda di tuduh dengan pembunuhan. Permohonan anda untuk jaminan hanya boleh di tangani oleh hakim di Supreme Court.

4. Jika anda telah dinyatakan sebagai pelaku kekasaran dalam keluarga yang berterusan dan anda telah dituduh dengan kesalahan kekasaran dalam keluarga. Ada maksud tentang apa itu pelaku kekasaran dalam keluarga yang berterusan.

Ada beberapa keadaan dimana anda harus tunjukkan alasan luar biasa mengapa anda harus dikasi jaminan untuk suatu kesalahan.

Jika anda dikasi jaminan

Jika anda dikasi jaminan anda harus membuat perjanjian tertulis (janji) ke mahkamah untuk datang ke mahkamah pada hari mahkamah berikutnya dan setiap hari mahkamah, mengikut persyaratan jaminan anda dan mengikut persyaratan jaminan penahanan rumah. Anda melakukan ini dengan mendatangani perjanjian jaminan.

Dalam artikel ketiga, kami akan melihat syarat-syarat yang boleh disertakan dengan jaminan anda.

Harmony Cup is set to be bigger again this year. It is being held at Lark Hill Sporting Complex in Rockingham and would be great to see everyone come along and support the boys.




